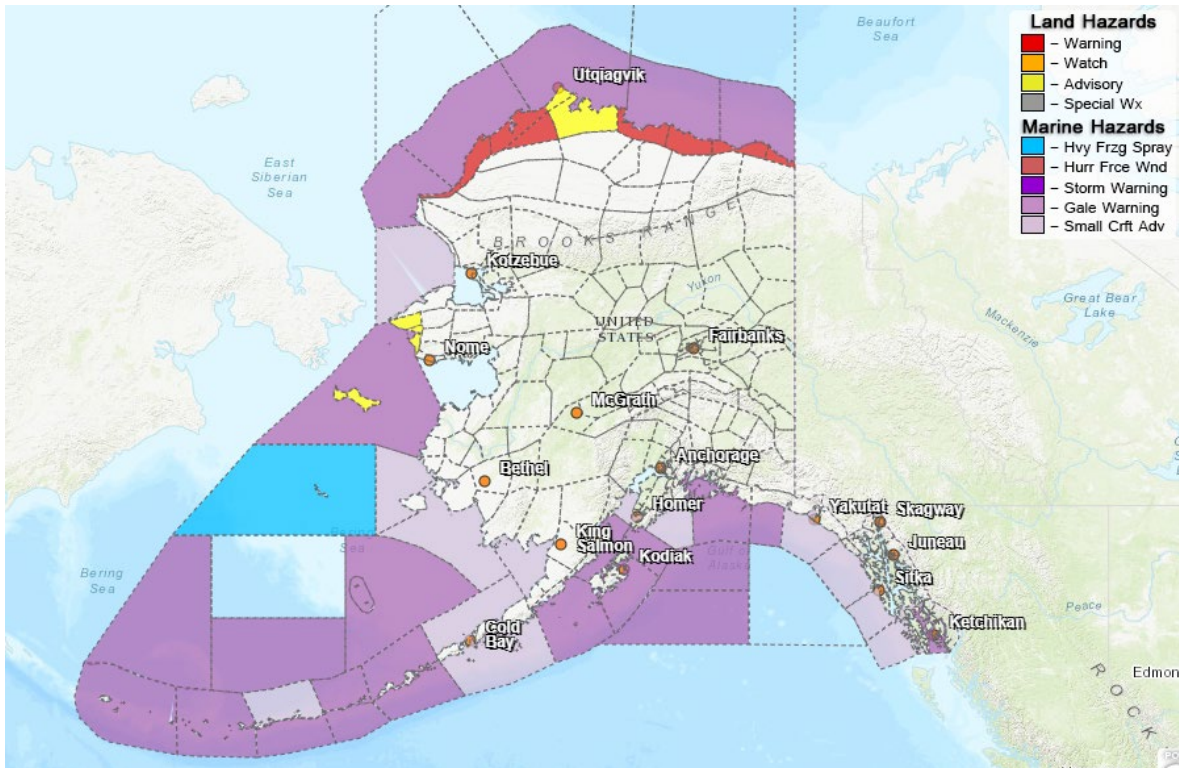
Cook Inlet M7.1 Earthquake (FEMA Declaration 4413-DR)

The SEOC has returned to Preparedness Level 1. This is the 112th day since the earthquake. FEMA command and general staff are still working out of the SEOC; a Joint Field Office (JFO) has not yet been set up. FEMA has 241 persons working in Alaska on this disaster. SBA has approved 514 home loans and 22 business loans totaling almost \$36.5 million.
