- 3/11 Governor Dunleavy declares a Public Health Disaster Emergency.
- 3/14 Governor Dunleavy announces the first confirmed case of COVID-19 in Alaska.
- 3/20 Governor Dunleavy announces Alaska COVID-19 Economic Stabilization Plan
- 3/25 First out-of-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Washington.
- 3/27 First in-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Anchorage.
- 3/28 Case count in the state exceeds 100.
- 4/3 Case count in the state exceeds 150.
- 4/7 Case count in the state exceeds 200.
- 4/9 President Trump approves a major disaster declaration for Alaska.
- 4/11 Case count in the state exceeds 250.
- 4/16 Case count in the state exceeds 300.
- 4/28 Case count in the state exceeds 350.
- 5/20 Case count in the state exceeds 400.
- 6/1 Case count in the state exceeds 450.
- 6/3 Case count in the state exceeds 500.

International & Interstate Travel:

Health Mandate 10 orders a mandatory 14-day self-quarantine for both international & interstate travelers (resident or non-resident) traveling to Alaska; failure to follow this order is punishable by law.

**HM 10 has been extended until midnight June 5, 2020.*

Starting 12:01am Saturday, June 6th, HM10 is amended to allow travelers to present proof of a negative COVID test taken prior to travel to avoid other HM10 requirements. Those travelers without proof will be able to choose between taking a COVID test at their arriving airport, or electing to complete a 14-day quarantine.

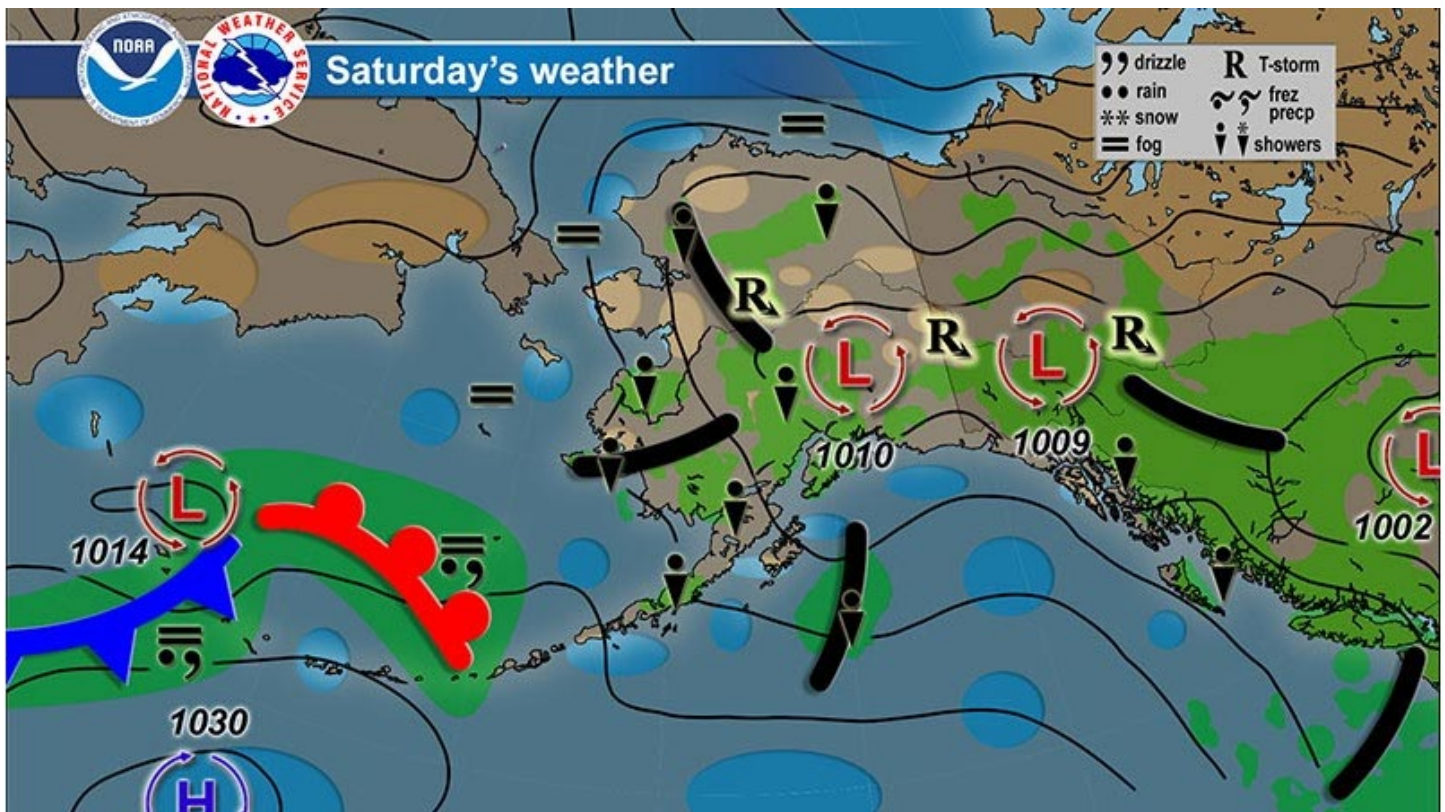
- Scattered showers, isolated wet T-storms. Fire potential increasing
