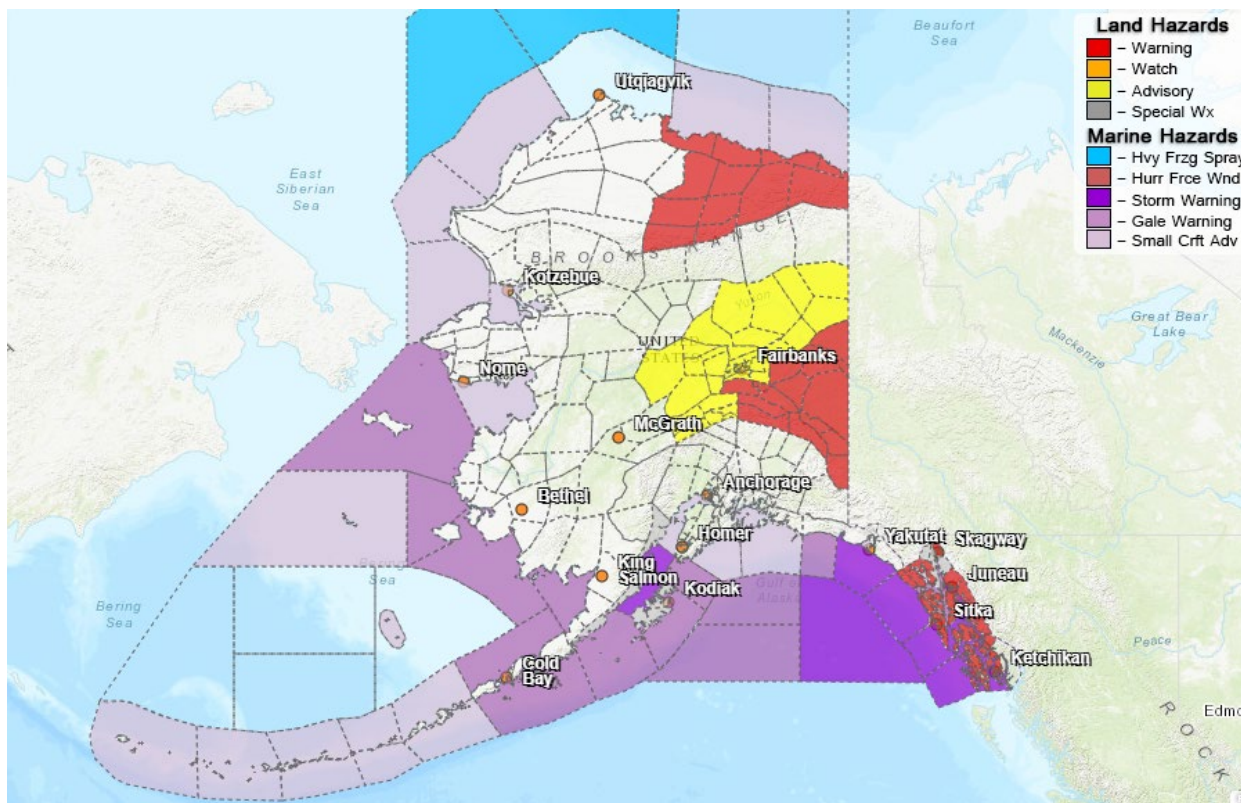

Significant Weather:



A Flash Flood Watch is in effect through Saturday morning for southeast Alaska coastal areas from Cape Decision to Salisbury Sound, including Sitka. There will be sharp rises on small streams through Friday with potential flooding by Friday night. Associated with the moderate to heavy rainfall, high winds will increase the risk of isolated landslides in prone areas late Friday afternoon into Friday night.

A Flood Watch is in effect from Friday afternoon through Saturday evening for most of southeast Alaska. Small streams will begin to see rises through Friday with potential flooding by Friday night into Saturday. Associated with the moderate to heavy rainfall, high winds may increase the possibility of isolated landslides in prone areas.

High Wind Warnings are in effect from this afternoon through Saturday for all of Southeast Alaska. Damaging winds will blow down trees and power lines. Widespread power outages are expected. Travel will be difficult, especially for high profile vehicles. Aviation and marine transportation will be impacted. Heavy rain will also accompany the winds.

A Special Weather Statement is in effect for Haines Borough and Lynn Canal. The Haines area will see 2 to 4 inches of rainfall over the next 36 hours through Saturday afternoon. Winds from the southeast will be strong, especially on Saturday after the low has pushed into Canada. Haines will experience gusts to 50 mph on Saturday.

Winter Weather Advisories and Winter Storm Warnings are in effect from Saturday morning into Sunday for most of the central and eastern Interior. Heavy snow is expected through the weekend, with a foot or more in some areas.

Winter Storm Warnings are in effect from today through Saturday for the central and eastern Beaufort Sea Coast and Northeastern Brooks Range for heavy snow and blowing snow. Travel is expected to be very difficult or impossible.

A Special Weather Statement is in effect for Kodiak Island for resuspended volcanic ash due to strong northwesterly winds.
