Mat-Su Windstorm

The SEOC spoke with the City Manager of Palmer yesterday for additional details regarding response operations from this past weekend’s wind storm event. The SEOC plans to meet with the City Manager today to discuss cost estimates and resource needs and identify how the state may be able to assist in support of the city’s local disaster declaration. The SEOC will continue to work with state and local agencies to assist with response and recovery efforts.

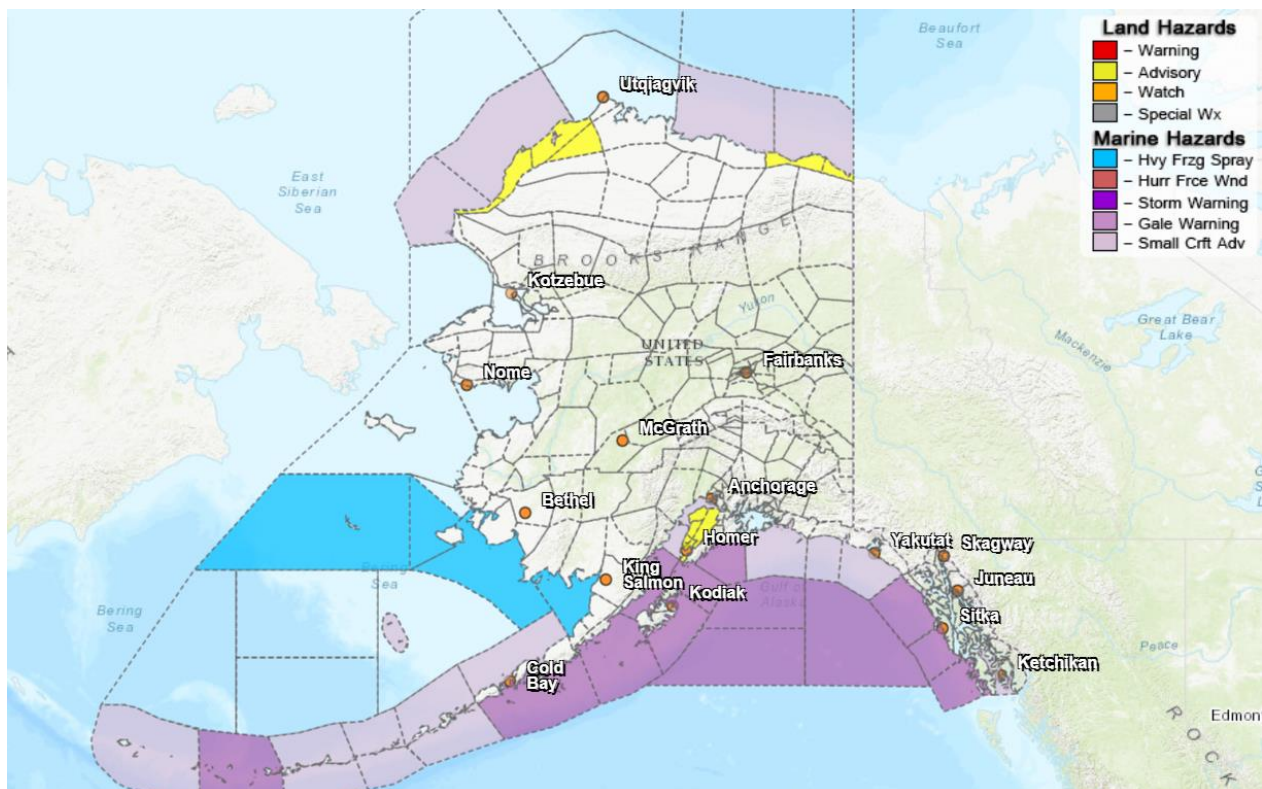

Significant Weather:



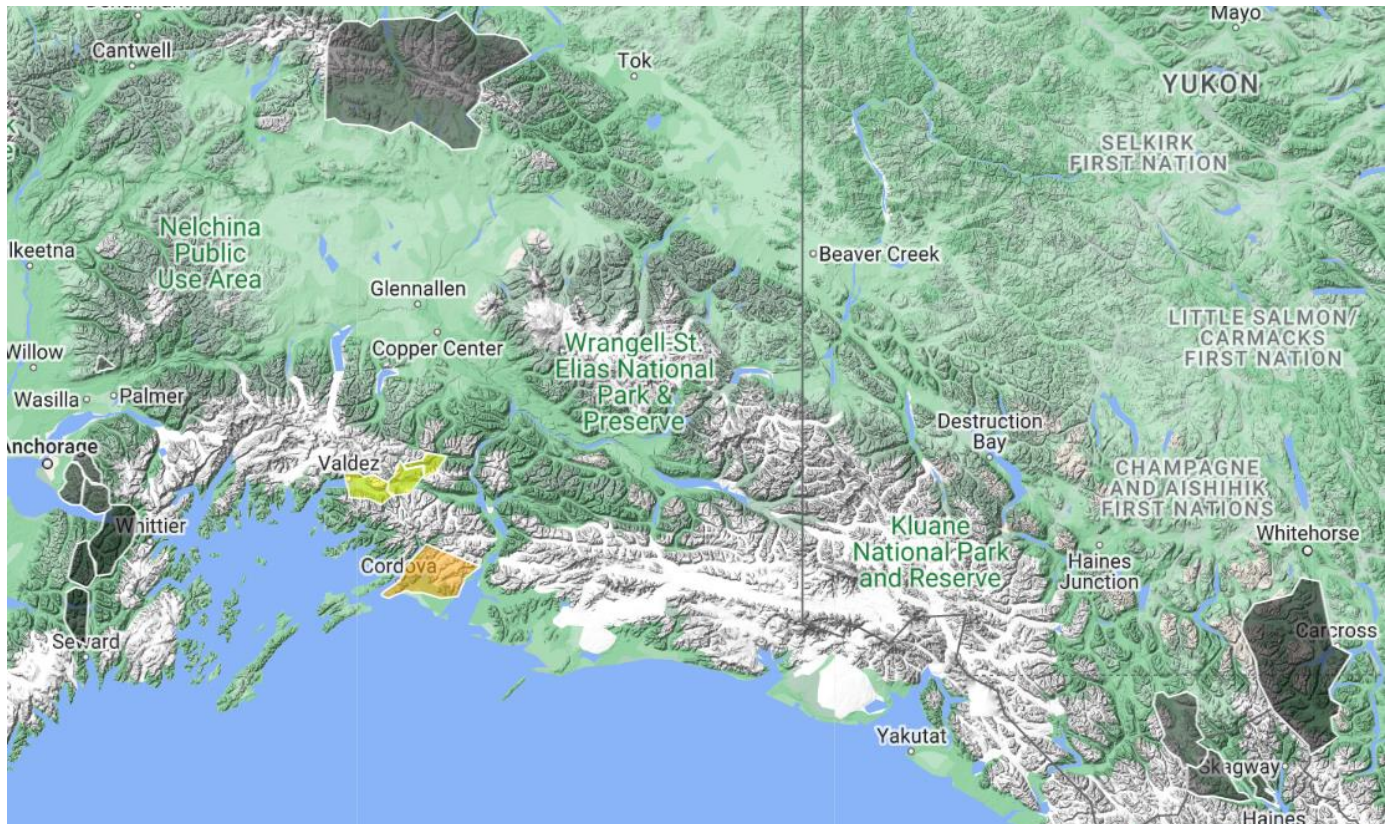
Dense fog advisory in effect for the Western Kenai Peninsula until 10am today.

Winter weather advisory in effect for the Western Arctic Coast until noon Thursday for strong winds and blowing snow. Winds of 30mph and wind chills as low as 55 degrees below zero are expected.

Winter weather advisory in effect for the Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast until 6pm this evening for strong winds and blowing snow. Winds of 30mph and wind chills to 50 degrees below zero are expected.

- Areas near Haines have a moderate advisory level above 1,500 ft and a considerable advisory level above 2,500ft.
- Areas near Cordova have a considerable advisory level above 1,000 ft and a moderate advisory level below 1,000ft.
- Areas near Valdez have a moderate advisory level at all elevations.
- **Turnagain Pass has considerable advisory conditions at this time.**
