Significant Issues:

Wrangell Landside Disaster:

Double lane emergency access routes remain open through the slide area with electrical power to southside residents. Wrangell Police continue to conduct a limited access schedule for residents on either side of the slide. Emergency response and recovery operations continue in coordination with debris removal and reactive search operations. State Individual Assistance Hotline and website is open for residents of Wrangell and Coffman Cove who have experienced damages to their home or have eligible personal expenses that are a direct result of the landslides. Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) is being used by Division of Geological and Geospatial Survey (DGGS) to assess slide stability and safety.

Prince of Wales Island, including City of Klawock and City of Craig:

City of Craig declared a local disaster emergency. SEOC continues to work with the City of Craig, Prince of Wales Island today to assess damages and coordinate state-level support to affected communities.

Diomedes – Potential Building Structural Collapse

SEOC continues to work with the City of Diomedes, Bering Strait School District, Kawerak, DOT, ANTHC and DEC to evaluate any potential impacts from the building collapse. Diomedes’s school is closed today but will resume school through remote learning on Monday.

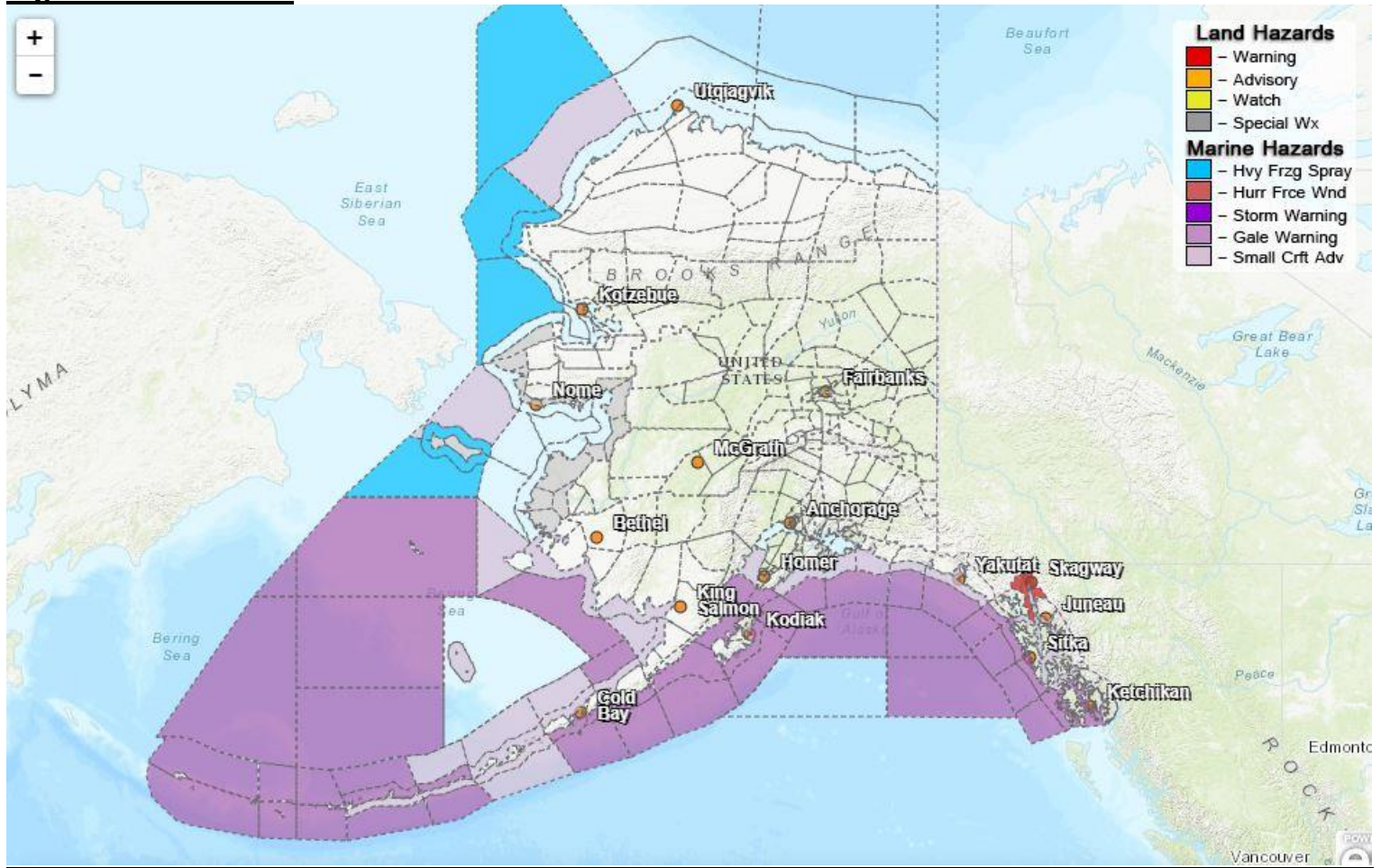

Winter Storm Warning: Municipality of Skagway; Haines Borough and Klukwan

- Heavy snow expected until 12:00 PM December 5th. Total snow accumulations of 5 to 12 inches.
- Travel will be very difficult and is discouraged unless it is an emergency.

Special Weather Statement: Shishmaref; Bering Strait Coast; Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills; Yukon Delta Coast; St Lawrence Island

- Unsettled Weather for the West Coast Tuesday through Friday with wind gusts up to 50 mph.
- Heavy snow squalls and periodic near blizzard conditions to the Bering Strait and Saint Lawrence Island into the weekend. Snow amounts will range from 2 to 5 inches.
- Westerly gales will bring elevated waters levels of 2 to 3 feet above the normal high tide line to parts of the YK Delta Wednesday.
