#### Significant Issues:

#### Riverwatch:

**Upper Yukon Division:** Yesterday Division flew Yukon River from Canadian border to Eagle for aerial reconnaissance of the ice breakup front. The Division then landed in Eagle and met with the Village Public Safety Officer for flood preparedness operations and meet in the local school with children, presenting on Riverwatch operations and emergency preparedness. Division intends to fly the Yukon today in the area around Eagle to monitor the breakup front, weather permitting.

SEOC conducted a community call with Yukon River communities yesterday to update on river conditions, riverwatch operations, and verify points of contact.

An ice jam was reported 23 miles upstream of Eagle. Temperatures are trending warmer in Upper Yukon versus Southwest. Water levels rising significantly for Yukon at Eagle to June high water levels.

Yesterday's Flood Watch for Eagle was revised to a Special Weather Statement with diminished flood threat for Eagle and breakup was reported in the area last night.

**Kuskokwim Division** – Division deploys to Bethel today with Division Supervisor, SEOC Operations Specialist, and Weather Service Hydrologist. They intend to initiate aerial Kuskokwim River ice surveillance operations this afternoon with a visit to Aniak and then return to Bethel to meet with community leaders.

**Cooper River Division** – SEOC Division Supervisor contacted Glenallen area Incident Command yesterday to establish situational awareness and there were no reports of impactful flooding, with newly installed culvers effectively diverting Moose Creek water for the Glenn Highway. A Flood Watch for snowmelt flooding for Copper River / Glenallen area is still in effect through Wednesday night.



• Fortymile Country – Due to the current river levels and ice conditions, the threat for flooding is diminished in the area around Eagle. However, ice jams can still pose a localized threat in the areas immediately around where they form.
