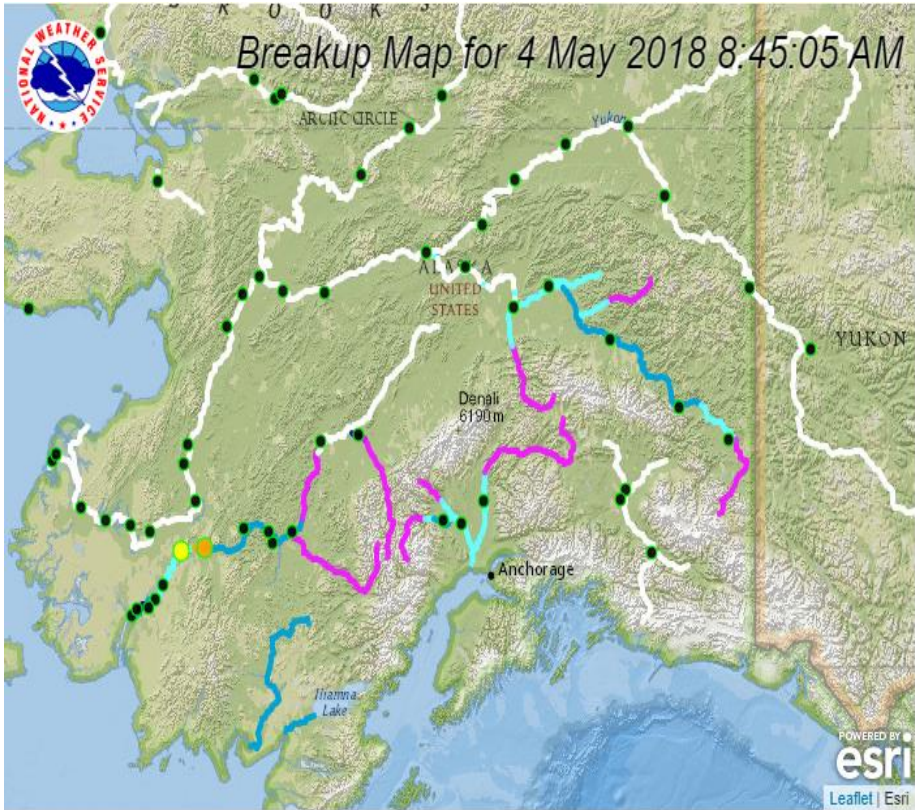

River Watch 2018 began on 4/30/2018 with the SEOC standing up to a Level 2 Preparedness Level. On 5/1/2018 the Upper Kuskokwim Division flew to Aniak to begin patrolling the Upper Kuskokwim. 5/1-5/3 daily flights along River from Aniak to Bethel and beyond where appropriate.

Upper Kuskokwim Division:

Travel from Bethel to Anchorage, AK late 5/3/2018. Upper Kuskokwim Division is closed and no longer operational

- No current major flooding. Kuskokwim is predicted to flush out smoothly. Yukon River has some open water along river banks, however ice has not begun to move.
