

### **Incident Overview:**



Travel from Bethel to Anchorage, AK late 5/3/2018. Upper Kuskokwim Division is closed and no longer operational

- No current major flooding. Kuskokwim is predicted to flush out smoothly. Yukon River has some open water along river banks, however ice has not begun to move.

Today: Rain and snow likely in the morning, then rain in the afternoon. Snow accumulation up to 1 inch. Highs in the mid 30s to lower 40s. North wind 15 to 30 mph.

Saturday: Cloudy with a chance of snow and rain showers. Lows around 30. Southwest wind 10 to 20 mph.

Sunday: Mostly cloudy with scattered snow showers. Highs in the mid to upper 30s. Southwest wind 10 to 15 mph.

Monday: Cloudy with a chance of rain and snow. Highs around 40. Lows 30 to 35.
