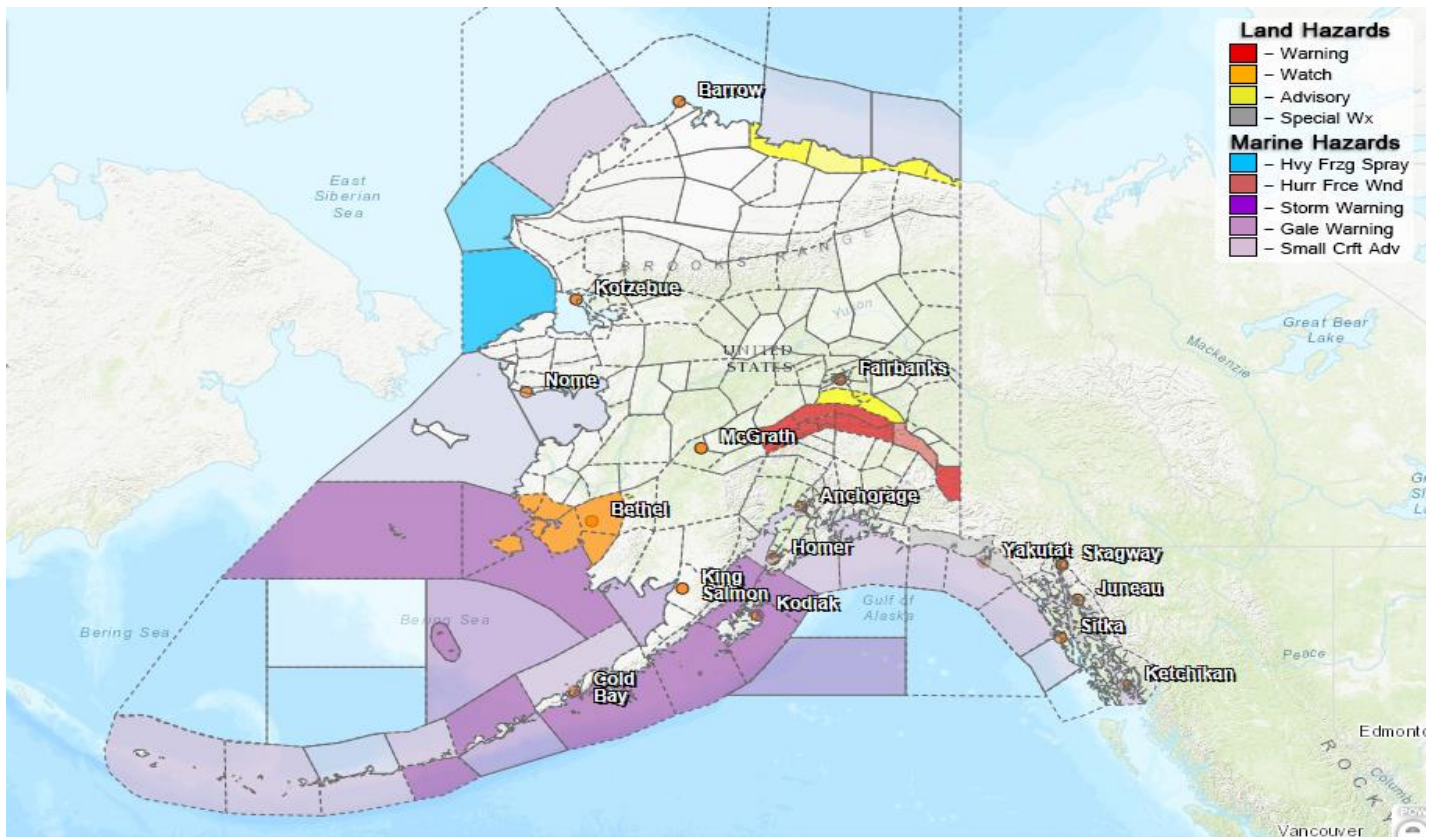

**River Watch and Spring Breakup:** The Upper Kuskokwim River division departed Bethel at 2100 last night back to Anchorage. They arrived at 2210 in Anchorage. Please see the attached River Watch Incident Situation Report for details of the latest flight observations from Wednesday evening.

The Upper Yukon team is projected to launch to the Eagle area this Sunday, May 6. For the Upper Yukon, reports indicate the ice in front of Dawson City is beginning to darken. This is an indicator the ice is deteriorating in place and the river may break and begin flowing soon.
