
Cook Inlet Earthquake (FEMA Declaration 4413-DR)

The SEOC remains activated to Level 3. FEMA command and general staff will operate out of the SEOC until a Joint Field Office (JFO) can be set up. FEMA disaster survivor assistance (DSA) teams continue to work with local government officials in all three affected jurisdictions. FEMA has opened a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) at the Spenard Community Recreation Center in Anchorage and will try to have another DRC set up tomorrow. SBA has now approved 41 loans totaling almost \$2.65 million in disaster assistance.

There is a Winter Storm Warning in effect from 6 am this morning to 1 am Akst Wednesday effecting the Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula, Including Buckland, Deering, Candle, Council, Haycock, Pilgrim Springs, Serpentine Hot Springs, and Taylor.

A Strong Storm Will Bring Elevated Water Levels Late This Week to the Chukchi Sea Coast, Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys, Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley, Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula, Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills, St Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast-Yukon Delta.

Additionally, the Yukon Delta is under a Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect until 6 pm akst this evening.
