Wildland Fires

SEOC has been in regular contact with jurisdictions and agencies engaged in wildland fire operations in the state. To date SEOC has received local declarations for fire response and recovery from:

- Mat-Su Borough
- Lake and Peninsula Borough
- Kenai Peninsula Borough

The Alaska National Guard conducted the following missions yesterday in response to SEOC resource orders:

- Traffic management, in coordination with the Alaska State Troopers, for the Swan Lake and Caribou
 Lake fires in the Kenai Peninsula Borough and the McKinley and Deshka Fires in the Mat-Su Borough.
- Alcantra Armory in support of wildland firefighter lodging and logistics.
- Helicopters on standby to support fire suppression

Department of Health and Social Services opened their EOC yesterday and are representing the SEOC Health and Medical Branch, and are participating with the Mass Care group.

Mat-Su Borough closed five schools in the fire area for the week.

The Parks Highway in the Mat-Su Borough and the Sterling Highway in the Kenai Peninsula Borough continue to see delays, lane restrictions, and closures due to smoke and fire impacts.

Water Shortages

SEOC continues to work with the Lake and Peninsula Borough, Kenai Peninsula Borough, Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation and regional tribal health organizations to support the following communities that have reported water shortages.

- Chignik Lagoon
- Seldovia
- Chignik Lake
- Tatitlek

2019 Fire Season

The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center, (AICC) is at Preparedness Level 3.

Wildland fire totals for 2019:

- Total Fires = 671
- Total Acres = 2,523,852.7. There are currently 224 active fires with 7 fires currently staffed.

Significant Weather:



NWS has issued a special weather statement for elevated surf for the following areas through the weekend:

- Northern and Western Arctic Coasts
- Chukchi Sea Coast
- · central and eastern Beaufort Sea
- St. Lawrence Island and the Bering Strait.

The dense smoke advisory remains in effect for the western Kenai Peninsula today.

A winter weather advisory remains in effect for snowfall in the Northeastern Brooks Range, above 2,000 feet elevation.

A flood advisory is in effect for the western Prince William Sound and western Kenai Peninsula to include Kenai Lake and the Kenai River from Cooper Landing to Skilak Lake.
