THREAT LEVEL CHANGES: SEOC LEVEL 1 – ROUTINE OPERATIONS

<u>Significant Issues:</u> The SEOC is continuing to evaluate a request for disaster assistance from the Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB) due to recent storm damages and power outages. DOT is also compiling response and repair costs for damage to several roads on the Kenai Peninsula.

Over the weekend ice jam flooding of Willow Creek, in the vicinity of the Deneki Bridge, caused several homes to be evacuated. Contact has been established with Matanuska Susitna Borough OEM. MSB sent the SEOC an official local declaration of disaster emergency requesting state public and individual assistance, and other emergency resources for their response and recovery from this event. MSB has been assisting residents needing to leave and/or re-renter their homes. MSB Operations and Maintenance Department is assessing mechanical solutions to the flooding. The SEOC will evaluate this request and provide support as appropriate and continues to monitor the situation.



#### Significant Weather:



A special weather statement has been issued for the Lower Koyukuk and Middle Yukon Valleys, Lower Yukon Valley, Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys, and the Upper Kuskokwim Valley. Expect very cold temperatures late this week. The western interior can expect persistent temperatures of 35-55 BELOW ZERO. Many villages in the western Interior will likely see ice fog Wednesday night and through the weekend.

A special weather statement has been issued for the Central Interior, Deltana and Tanana Flats, Denali, Eastern Alaska Range, Middle Tanana Valley, Southeastern Brooks Range, Upper Koyukuk Valley, Upper Tanana Valley and the Fortymile Country, and the Yukon Flats and Surrounding

Uplands. Expect very cold temperatures late this week. The western interior can expect persistent temperatures of 35-55 BELOW ZERO.

A special weather statement has been issued for the Eastern Aleutians. Blowing snow is expected to reduce visibility in the eastern Aleutians through Wednesday morning. The strong low pressure system is expected to bring strong winds and heavy precipitation.

A winter storm warning is in effect for Haines Borough and Lyn Canal, Misty Fjords, Taiya Inlet and the Klondike Highway until 9am today.

A winter weather advisory is in effect for the Central Aleutians.

A wind chill advisory is in effect for the Kuskokwim Delta, Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys, Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys, Chuckchi Sea Coast, Northeastern Brooks Range, Southeastern Brooks Range, Upper Koyukuk Valley, Yukon Flats, and the Central Interior.

A flood advisory is in effect for the Susitna Valley.
