- 20 MAR 20 Gov Dunleavy Announces Alaska COVID-19 Economic Stabilization Plan. DHSS announces 12th confirmed case in state.
- 25 MAR 20 First out-of-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Washington.
- 27 MAR 20 First in-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Anchorage.
- 28 MAR 20 Case count in the state exceeds 100.
- 03 APR 20 Case count in the state exceeds 150.
- 07 APR 20 Case count in the state exceeds 200.

Government Services

Schools:

The State of Alaska (SOA) <u>Health Mandate 008</u> (3/20) dictates that all scheduled public-school days through May 1, 2020 will be non-student contact days in which students will not be attending school. Schools have begun deployment of distance learning.

Child Care:

DHSS is fielding questions from licensed providers. Guidance was published in the <u>SOA Health Alert 008</u> (3/17). Additional guidance will be provided as necessary.



Community Safety

International & Interstate Travel:

SOA Health Mandate 010 (3/23) orders a mandatory 14-day self-quarantine for both international & interstate travelers (resident or non-resident) traveling to Alaska; failure to follow this order is punishable by the law.

United States and Canada are temporarily restricting all non-essential travel across the ALCAN border. "Non-essential" travel includes travel that is considered tourism or recreational in nature.

Intrastate Travel:

<u>SOA Health Mandate 012</u> (3/28) suspends all in-state travel unless necessary to support identified critical infrastructure or for identified critical personal needs. A number of communities have enacted additional screening requirements in addition to those outlined in the Governor's Health Mandates.



Health and Medical

Epidemiological Surveillance:

Efforts continue to identify new cases and prevent community spread of the disease.

Public Health

Laboratory:

Statewide Case Count totals: 226 positive/27 hospitalized/32 recovered/7 deaths. *

A total of 7,068 tests have been conducted within the state.

* includes 1 Alaska resident located in WA state



Emergency Medical Flight Services:

Air Operations Branch is developing agreements for temporary helicopter pad use at alternate care sites to facilitate the transport of COVID-19 patients.

Patient Movement Local health providers are experiencing disruptions to routine patient movement as a result of air carrier instability



Blood Bank:

Blood Bank of Alaska has reported blood shortages due to the coronavirus outbreak. They are continuing to solicit for healthy donors.



Distribution:

Efforts continue to source sufficient personal protective equipment and materials such as ventilators for hospitals statewide. Alaska has received 2 shipments from the DHHS Strategic National Stockpile to date.



Hospitals:

<u>Health Mandate 005.1</u> (4/7) suspended all non-urgent and elective procedures until June 15, 2020 to assist with conservation of medical supplies.

Mat-Su


No significant weather impacts expected next 48 hours. Some wind on the highways.
