

#### Significant Weather:



A High Wind Warning is in effect for the Central Aleutians until noon today. Southeast winds 50 to 70 mph with gusts up to 85 mph expected. A large low-pressure system is moving into the area and is forecasted to bring a broad area of storms and hurricane force winds to the waters west of Unalaska and the Pribilof Islands. 40- to 50-foot seas are also forecast for the area, with seas as high as 55 feet on the Pacific side of the Aleutians from Adak to Attu Island on Thursday.

A Blizzard Warning is in effect for the Western Arctic Coast until 6:00 P.M. Friday. Winds gusting as high as 40 mph will cause whiteout conditions in blowing snow. Significant drifting of the snow is likely, along with wind chills as low as 45 below zero.


A Winter Storm Watch is in effect for St. Lawrence Island & the Bering Strait Coast until late Friday night. Winds gusting as high as 45 mph could cause whiteout conditions in blowing snow. Total snow accumulations of up to one inch are expected.

A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect for the following areas:

- Misty Fjords from 9:00 P.M. today until 9:00 P.M. Friday. Total snow accumulations of 7 to 9 inches are expected
- Yukon Delta on Friday from 6:00 A.M. until 6:00 P.M. Winds gusting as high as 45 mph will cause areas of blowing and drifting snow reducing the visibility.

A Special Weather Statement has been issued for the Northern Panhandle. A weather front will move into the north-central panhandle Thursday night into early Friday, bringing 2 to 4 inches of snow accumulation in an area between Angoon and Tenakee Inlet, north to Hoonah and Gustavus. A second front will move into the area late Friday into Saturday, with the potential to bring another 3 to 5 inches of snow accumulation from Juneau, north to Haines and Skagway.
