Significant Issues:

Southeast Alaska December Storm:

The team of geotechnical consultants in Haines is continuing with their field investigation in the area of the Beach Road landslide in support of community response and recovery activities.

Tuluksak Water System Fire:

The newly installed non-potable watering point continues to work well and is providing the community access to water. Throughout the last week the SEOC coordinated multiple shipments of drinking water to Tuluksak, and the SEOC remains in regular contact with community leadership to address any immediate needs.

Selawik Power Outage:

The SEOC is continuing to work with the Northwest Arctic Borough, ANTHC and Selawik to expedite the installation of a watering point at the water plant as well as working to provide additional sanitation supplies for the community while AVEC continues to work on restoring power. The SEOC will remain in contact with the community to identify any additional needs for assistance.

Unalakleet Water Issues:

Repair efforts to thaw the frozen transmission lines continue. The SEOC remains in contact with the community to identify any needs for assistance.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic:

A unified command has been established at the SEOC. The SEOC continues to support statewide response to COVID-19.

State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS)

DHSS is operating as the Medical Branch under the State EOC/Unified Command.



Wind Chill Warnings and Advisories remain in effect until noon tomorrow for the Western Arctic Coast, Chukchi Sea Coast, St. Lawrence Island and the Bering Strait Coast.

A Winter Storm Warning for heavy snow is in effect until tomorrow afternoon for Juneau and Northern Admiralty Island. 3 to 9 inches of snow accumulation is expected.

Winter Weather Advisories remain in effect through Sunday morning for blowing snow and cold wind chills for much of the state, including the Southeastern Brooks Range, Koyukuk Valley, Yukon Flats, Tanana Valleys, Denali, Eastern Alaska Range, Upper Kuskokwim Valley, Cooper River Basin and the Susitna Valley.
