

Significant Weather:



A Blizzard Warning has been issued for the Pribilof Islands from 1:00 A.M. until 10:00 A.M. tomorrow.

A Winter Storm Warning is in effect for the Yakutat area until 7:00 P.M. today. Heavy blowing snow is expected with total accumulations of 5 to 9 inches.

Winter Weather Advisories are in effect for the following areas:

- Interior Bristol Bay until 1:00 A.M. tomorrow for blowing snow and high winds.
- Elfin Cove, Pelican, Skagway, Haines, Gustavus and Juneau until 4:00 P.M. today for blowing snow and high winds.
- The Brooks Range until noon tomorrow for wind chills up to 50° below zero and blowing snow.
- Denali, the Eastern Alaska Range, Tanana Valley and the Fortymile Country from noon today until 6:00 P.M. tomorrow for blowing snow, high winds and low wind chill values.
- Eastern Norton Sound, Nulato Hills, St. Lawrence Island, Bering Strait Coast, Yukon Delta and the Lower Yukon Valley until 6:00 P.M. today for high winds, blowing snow, reduced visibility and low wind chill values.

Wind Chill Advisories are in effect for the Arctic and Chukchi Sea Coasts, Baldwin and Seward Peninsulas, along with the Koyukuk, Kobuk, Noatak and Yukon Valleys through tomorrow morning.
