Significant Issues:

Emmonak Water Supply

The SEOC remains in contact with the City of Emmonak, YKHC, and DEC regarding the situation with the water intake system in Emmonak. A YKHC Remote Matienance Worker has been assisting with repairs to a pressure pump and expects the system to be fully back online today. A boil water notice has been issued until repairs are made. The SEOC will continue to monitor the situation in conjunction with the City of Emmonak, YKHC and DEC.

Selawik Structure Fire

Yesterday the SEOC received a report of a structure fire in Selawik and a reported disruption to the City's water system. SEOC contacted the City of Selawik, Northwest Arctic Borough, DEC, and DPS for more information. The community was able to prevent the fire from spreading to other structures. There were no reported injuries or fatalities. As of yesterday morning, the community water plant was operational, and water service had been restored to most of the community. Local crews are working to repair or bypass a water supply junction which was damaged by the fire in order to restore service to the remainder of the system. There is currently no request for assistance from the community as a result of the fire. The SEOC will continue to monitor the situation in conjunction with the City of Selawik, Northwest Arctic Borough DEC and DPS.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic:

A unified command has been established at the SEOC. The SEOC continues to support statewide response to COVID-19.



Significant Weather:



A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect through noon on Saturday for the Eastern Alaska Range. Two to four inches of snow are expected along the Richardson Highway and Tok Cutoff.

A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect until 2pm this afternoon for the Yukon flats and surrounding uplands for snow accumulation up to 1 inch, along with blowing snow.

A Wind Advisory is in effect from 1pm this afternoon to 1am Sunday for the Upper Koyukuk Valley for winds 15-25mph, with gusts up to 40mph.

A Special Weather Statement for low temperatures has been issued for the Central and Eastern Interior for Friday night. Lows in the upper 20s to mid 30s are expected throughout the area.
