Significant Issues:

River Watch 2022

Flood warning for snowmelt in along Moose Creek and Glennallen north of Glenn Hwy in effect until **11 am AKDT Sunday**.

Governor Mike Dunleavy has issued three disaster declarations. The 2022 Spring Floods, the 2022 Lowell Point Landslide in the City of Seward, and the Galena Fire Hall roof collapse will now be eligible for State of Alaska disaster recovery programs. **Individuals and families can now apply for state disaster grants as of 05/16/22.**

The Riverwatch teams have been demobilized, and are transitioning to flood response and recovery. Continuing to monitor for potential snow melt flooding concerns.

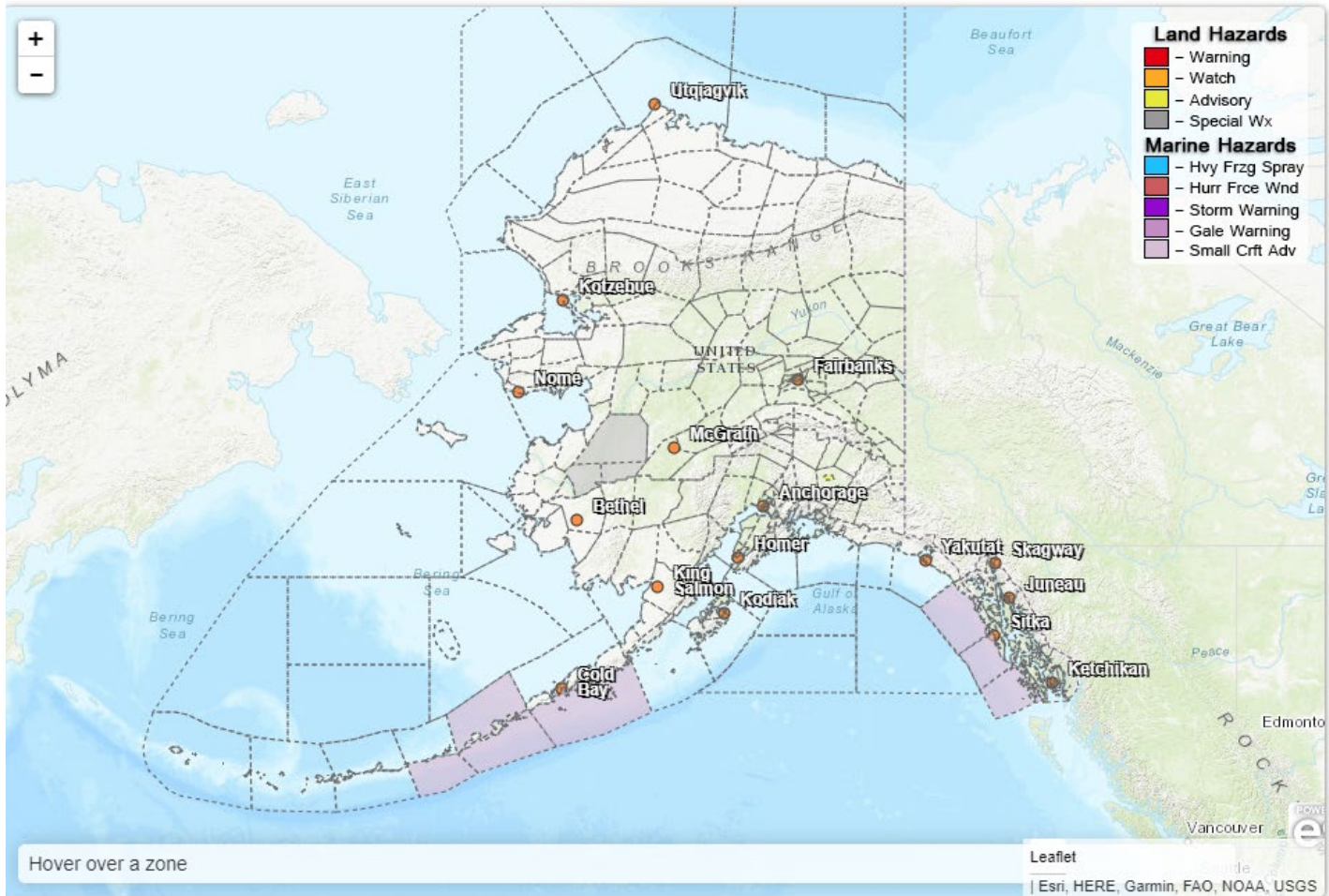
