Significant Issues:

Statewide Fires

The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center (AICC) is coordinating statewide wildland firefighting suppression efforts on 10 staffed fires across Alaska at Planning Level 3 of 5. Emergency Management agencies across the state are engaged in response to fire impacts on persons and property. Overall there are 90 active fires in the state, with 5 new yesterday and 75 being monitored – some of which are being suppressed only with occasional aircraft. To date over 850,000 acres have burned.

The lightening caused East Fork Fire (#160), at over 150,000 acres, is burning near St. Mary's with risk to Mountain Village, Pilots Station, and Pitkas Point. 255 firefighters are assigned to this fire under the command of the Alaska Type II Green Incident Management Team.

The Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation, Red Cross, and Alaska National Guard are operating two shelters in Bethel, one at the National Guard Armory and one at the Gladys Jung Elementary School, for vulnerable residents relocated from this fire. 119 were sheltered overnight.

As fire risk decreases, plans are now underway to begin returning relocated residents to their communities and consolidate to one shelter at the Alaska National Guard Armory.

SEOC has a Mass Care Group Supervisor in Bethel supporting State disaster response coordination for the communities threatened by fire and has requested eight additional Alaska Organized Militia service members to support shelter operations there.

In addition, multiple organizations are supporting the Mass Care response to the East Fork fire with food, supplies, donations, and counseling including the Salvation Army, Alaska Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters, Association of Village Council Presidents, City of Bethel, Lower Kuskokwim School District, Lions Club, local churches, and the public.

In addition to the East Fork Fire, SEOC is actively engaged with other communities near fires to provide support for non-suppression needs while AICC coordinates fire suppression.

A new, lighten caused 100-acre fire, near Wickersham Dome in Fairbanks was staffed with firefighters yesterday.

In southwest Alaska, the Alaska Type II Incident Management Black Team took command this morning of 17 lightening caused fires burning in the Kuskokwim River corridor of southwest Alaska near communities including; the Aghaluk Mountain Fire (#206) burning near the communities of Sleetmute, Red Devil, Georgetown, and Crooked Creek; the Submarine Creek Fire (#220) burning near the community of Medfra and the Nixon Mine; and multiple fires burning near Lime Village.

Air quality advisory for Southwest Alaska will be impacted by smoke from a complex of fires located throughout the southwest region. Advisory issued until end of event.

Air quality advisory for Central and Eastern Alaska will be impacted by wildfire smoke from the large complex of fires located in Southwest and Western Alaska. Advisory will be issued until end of event.

Air quality advisory for Western Interior Alaska will be impacted by smoke from Southwest, Hog Butte, and Submarine Creek fires. Advisory will be issued until end of event.

Air Quality will vary between GOOD and UNHEALTHY depending on wind flow and proximity to the fires in all the above areas.


