Significant Issues:

Statewide Fires

The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center (AICC) is coordinating statewide wildland firefighting suppression efforts on 13 staffed fires across Alaska with 550 personnel at Planning Level 3 of 5. Overall, there are 89 active fires in the state, with 6 new yesterday and 72 being monitored – some of which are being suppressed only with occasional aircraft operations. To date over 980,000 acres have burned. Emergency Management agencies across the state are engaged in response to fire impacts on persons and property.

The lightening caused East Fork Fire (#160), at over 153,000 acres, is burning near St. Mary's, Mountain Village, Pilots Station, and Pitkas Point. 241 firefighters are assigned to this fire under the command of the Alaska Type II Green Incident Management Team.

Last week, when the fire risk to the communities near the East Fork Fire increased, several vulnerable persons were relocated to Bethel. The Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation, Red Cross, and Alaska National Guard opened two shelters, one at the National Guard Armory and one at the Gladys Jung Elementary School, for relocated residents. As the fire risk decreases, relocated residents are being returned to their communities. Yesterday the shelter at the school was closed, while the Armory sheltered 53 relocated persons overnight.

SEOC has a Mass Care Group Supervisor in Bethel supporting State disaster response coordination for the communities threatened by fire and six additional Alaska Organized Militia service members began arriving in Bethel last night to support shelter operations there.

In addition, multiple organizations are supporting the Mass Care response to the East Fork fire with food, supplies, donations, and counseling including the Salvation Army, Alaska Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters, Association of Village Council Presidents, City of Bethel, Lower Kuskokwim School District, Bethel Lions Club, local churches, and the public.

In addition to the East Fork Fire, SEOC is actively engaged with other communities near fires to provide support for non-suppression needs while AICC coordinates fire suppression.

Yukon Territories Canada – Flooding:

The Yukon Territories Emergency Coordination Center advised SEOC that they have moved to Level 2 of 3 in response to flooding throughout the Territory and that there may be operational impacts to roads coming into Alaska in the coming week.


