Significant Issues:

Statewide Fires

Yesterday the Alaska Interagency Coordination Center moved to Planning Level 4 of 5 for wildland fire given the number of fires in the state and forecasted weather. A high-pressure ridge has set up over much of Alaska, causing increasing fire risk.

SEOC is in daily contact with State Forestry for contingency planning of Mass Care, evacuation, National Guard, and other resources.

SEOC participated with the Denali Borough, City of Anderson, and Clear Fire Incident Command on a contingency planning call for the 1,930-acre Clear Fire (#346). A Type 2 Incident Management Team from the lower 48 has been ordered for management of this fire.

SEOC is actively monitoring and participating in inter-agency briefings on an additional 14 fires that pose some risk to local communities, out of the 140 active fires burning in the state.

SEOC will conduct a Mass Care Coordination call today for fire response coordination and has been in contact with the Red Cross to coordinate fire contingency planning.

A joint state/FEMA team traveled to the Kenai Peninsula Borough and City of Seward yesterday to conduct a Preliminary Damage Assessment.


