**Significant Issues:**

Late Friday, the SEOC received an emergency declaration from the City of Skagway. The declaration asks for assistance in collaborating with State and Federal agencies to address and mitigate the risk of future slides as well as to activate response and recover aspects of local or interjurisdictional disaster or emergency plans. Lastly the declaration requests that the Governor declare a disaster emergency to exist and provide all possible disaster assistance to the Municipality of Skagway. They have fully activated their emergency operations plan, and their EOC is working a 24-hour rotational basis.

Another slide occurred over the weekend damaging the shipping container city officials had placed as a tunnel to protect cruise ship passengers since receiving the declaration. SEOC will continue to coordinate and support the the City of Skagway with this developing situation.

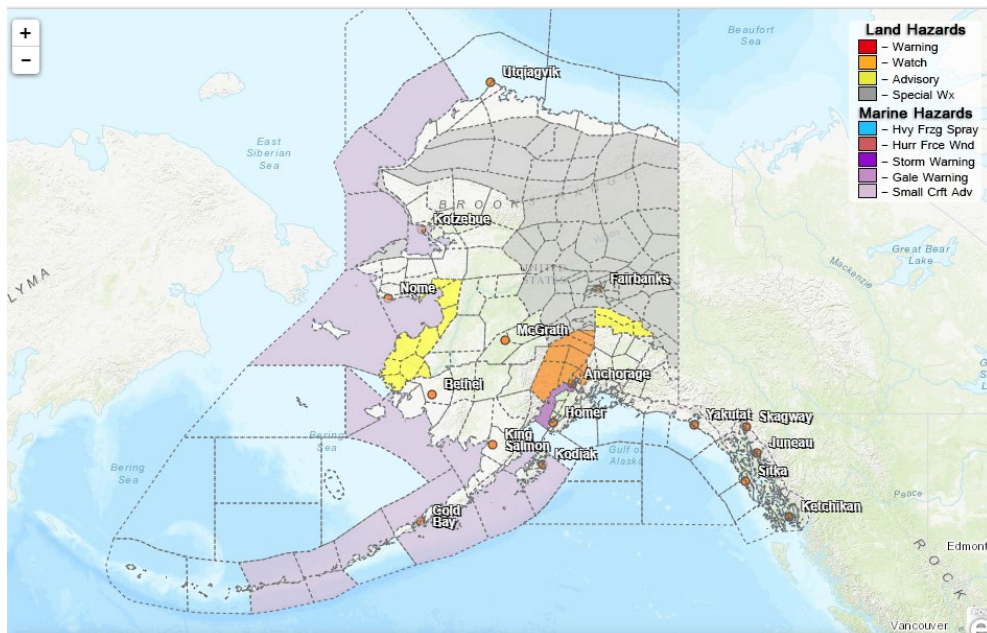

## Significant Weather:



Flood watch has been issued for excessive rain fall flooding in Mat-Su Valley. Small streams and rivers including Willow Creek, Little Susitna River could see flooding due to excessive run off. Watch is in effect from this morning through Tuesday afternoon.

Special weather statement has been issued for Northeastern Brooks Range including areas of Anaktuvuk Pass, Atigun Pass, Galbraith Lake, Sagwon, and Franklin Bluffs. Heavy snow is expected with accumulation of 4 inches possible.

Special Weather Statement issued for high surf for the areas of Western Arctic Coast, Northern Arctic Coast, Baldwin Peninsula, Chukchi Sea and Northern and interior Seward Peninsula.
