## **Significant Issues:**

SEOC has moved to Level 2 – Heightened Awareness due to the flooding in the Mat-Su Valley and other areas we are monitoring.

A Silver Alert was issued yesterday for Eugene Frank. He is a 75 year old, vulnerable adult that may have been hitchhiking from Seward to Anchorage, last seen at the Seward Essential One Gas Station. He is white male, 6 feet tall, 220 lbs., bald, with brown eyes. Last seen wearing a tie-dye shirt, red pajama pants, and slippers. The SEOC continues to work with the Mat-Su Borough and the City of Houston in regards to multiple locations of flooding impacting roads and homes and their disaster Declaration. The Mat-Su Borough Emergency Management reports an estimated 20 homes affected by flooding off of Wasilla-Fishhook Rd and an additional approximate 40 homes in the City of Houston that have water in or around the property. According to the Borough this morning 8 roads are still blocked and many homes still have water in or around the property.

The SEOC continues to work with and assist the Municipality of Skagway with their request for emergency declaration and request for state assistance with the continued landside issue.
