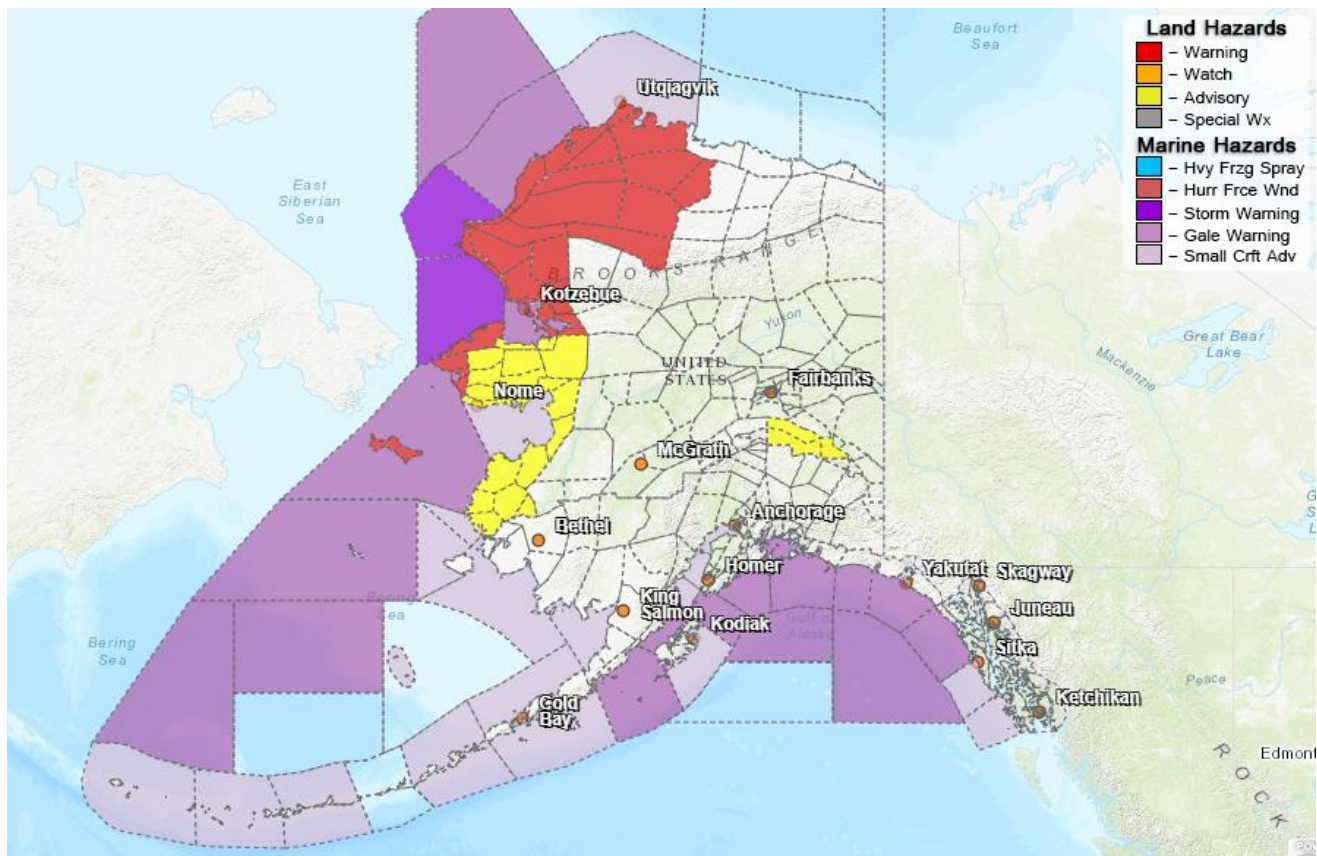

## Significant Weather:



The following weather watches, warnings, or advisories have been issued:

- A Coastal Flood Warning remains in effect for the Northern and Western Arctic Coast, Chukchi Sea Coast and Baldwin Peninsula from tonight through Friday afternoon. Water levels are expected to rise 3 to 8 feet above the normal high tide line across the region during this event and significant erosion is possible.
- A High Wind Warning has been issued for the following areas:
  - Western Arctic Coast and the Chukchi Sea Coast – This afternoon through Thursday night. South winds 30 to 40 mph with gusts to 70 mph.
  - St. Lawrence Island and the Bering Strait Coast – From noon today through midnight tonight. South winds 30 to 40 mph with gusts to 60 mph.
  - Northwestern Brooks Range – From 10:00 P.M. today through Thursday afternoon. South winds 25 to 35 mph with gusts to 65mph.
- A High Wind watch remains in effect for the Northern Arctic Coast from Thursday afternoon through Friday evening.
- A Wind Advisory is in effect for the Eastern Alaska Range from midnight tonight through noon on Friday. South winds 25 to 40 mph with gusts to 65 mph are expected.
- A High Surf Advisory has been issued for St. Lawrence Island, the Bering Strait Coast and Eastern Norton Sound – From midnight tonight until Saturday morning. Water levels are expected to rise 3 to 5 feet with surf running well above the normal high tide line.
- A Coastal Flood Advisory has been issued for the Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula for Thursday through Saturday. Minor coastal flooding is expected as water levels rise 4 to 5 feet above the normal high tide line.
