Major Coastal Sea Storms

Overall incident operations for the 2022 September West Coast Storm (DR-4672) disaster have transitioned from response in the SEOC, to recovery coordinated through the State/FEMA Joint Field Office. Mass care operations will continue to be coordinated through the SEOC.

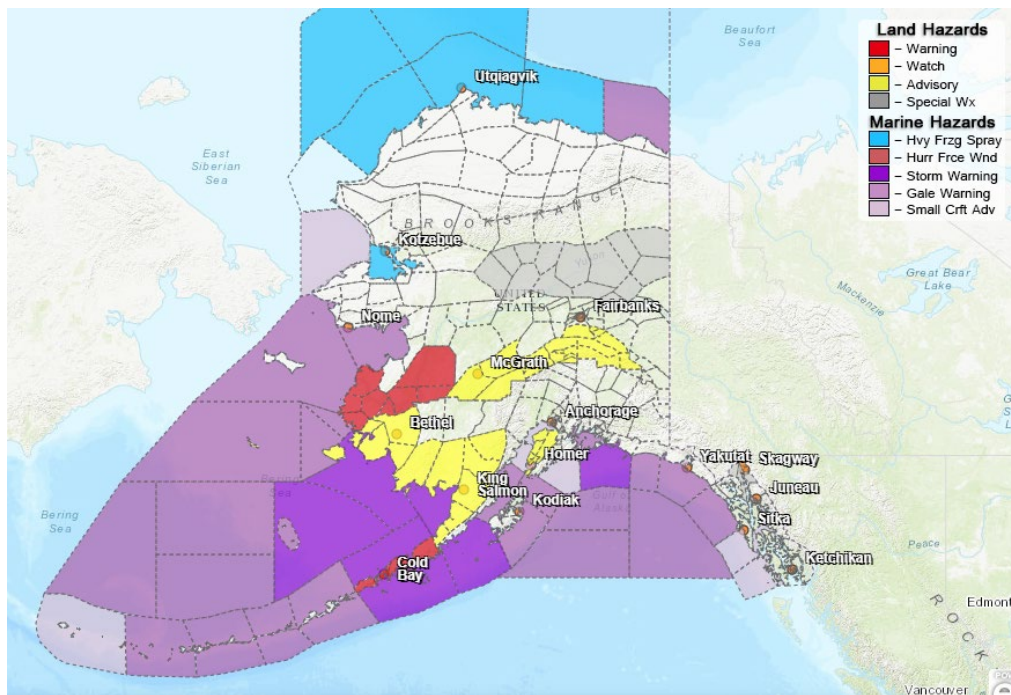

Significant Weather:



- High wind
- Special weather statement issued for gusty winds and blowing snow over Dalton Highway Summits. Blowing snow will reduce visibility and make traveling difficult.
- Wind advisories in effect from 1:00PM this afternoon until 6:00AM Wednesday for Delta Junction South, North of Black Rapids, Denali, and Upper Kuskokwim Valley along the Alaska Range. South winds from 30 to 40 mph with gusts up to 65 mph expected.
- Winter weather advisory in effect until 6:00 AM Wednesday for the Upper Kuskokwim Valley from McGrath southwest. Total snow accumulation of 5 to 12 inches expected.

- Winter weather advisory in effect from 10:00AM Tuesday to 1:00AM Wednesday for Western Kenai Peninsula. Snow expected, with total snow accumulations of 2 to 6 inches, highest amounts from Soldotna north to Nikiski.
- Winter storm warning in effect from 1:00AM Tuesday to 6:00AM Wednesday for the Yukon Delta. Heavy snow expected with near Blizzard Conditions. Total snow accumulations of 6 to 9 inches. Winds gusting as high as 45 mph.
- Winter storm warning in effect 1:00AM Tuesday to 6:00AM Wednesday for Lower Yukon Valley. Heavy snow expected with near Blizzard Conditions. Total snow accumulations of 6 to 11 inches. Winds gusting as high as 40 mph.
- Winter storm watch in effect for the Upper Kuskokwim Valley. Heavy snow possible with total accumulations of 8 to 12 inches possible.
- Special weather statement issued for snow across the Northern Panhandle.
