North Slope Borough Requests State Assistance for Oct 7 Chukchi Sea Storm

North Slope Borough has submitted a request for State assistance for damages to public infrastructure caused by the Chukchi Sea storm on October 7. Their disaster costs and damages are estimated to be about \$1.4 million at this time.

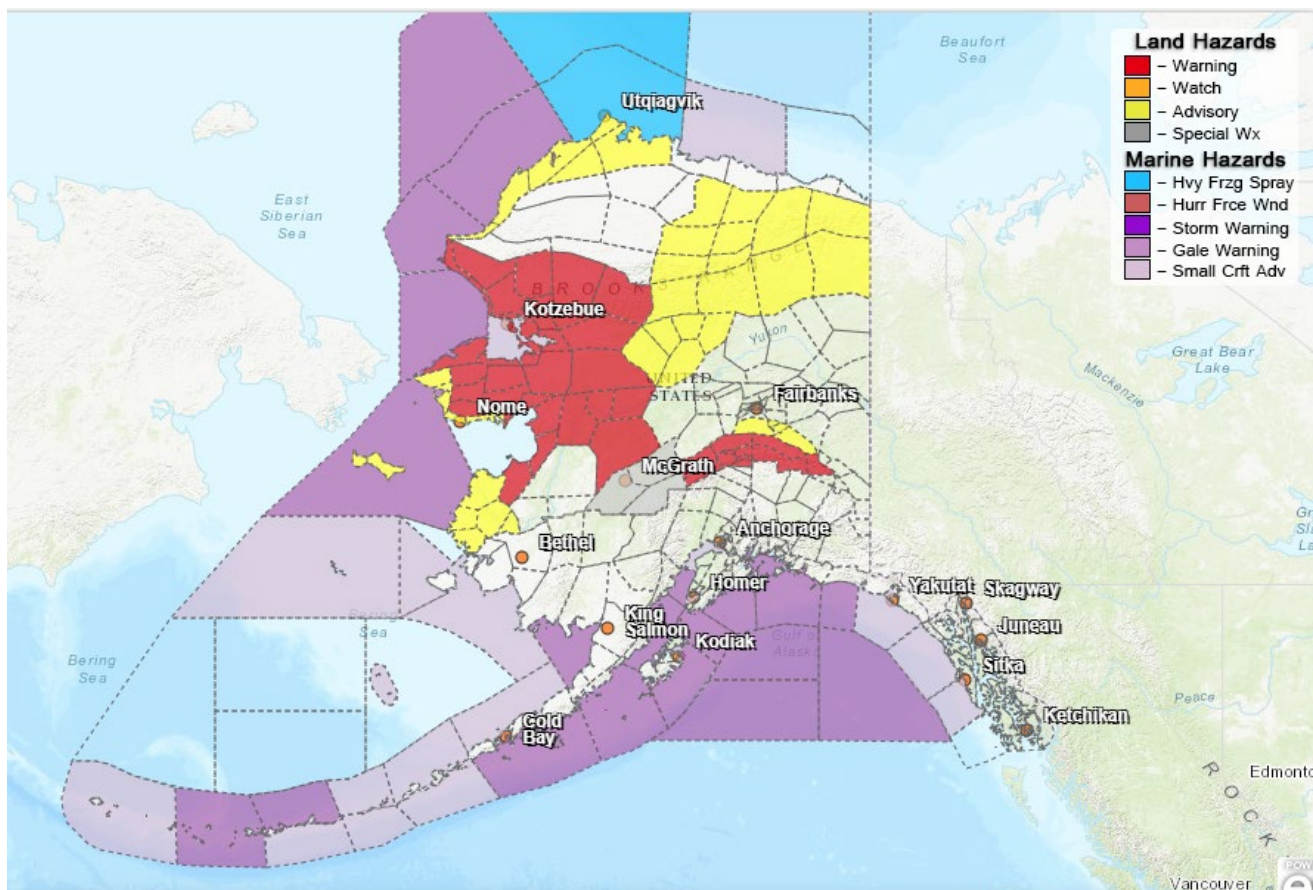

Significant Weather:



Winter Weather Advisories have been issued for the following areas:

- Southern Seward Peninsula Coast until 3:00PM this afternoon. Blowing snow with accumulation of 1 to 3 inches with gusts up to 55 mph.
- Upper Koyukuk Valley until 3:00pm today. Snow with accumulation of 3 to 5 inches.

- Port Heiden to Iliamna from 8:00 A.M. today through 6:00 P.M. today. Two inches of snow and winds gusting to 60mph.
- St. Lawrence Island, the Southern Seward Peninsula Coast and the Bering Strait Coast until 3:00PM today. 2 to 5 inches of snow and gusts of 55 mph.
- Northeast Brooks Range, along Dalton Highway from Atigun Pass North. Blowing snow with accumulation of 2 inches with gusts up to 50 mph.

Winter Storm Warnings have been issued for the following areas:

- Lower Koyukuk and Middle Yukon Valleys until 3:00PM today. Heavy/blowing snow with 2 to 6 inches of accumulations and gusts of as high as 35 mph.
- Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys until Midnight tonight. Heavy and blowing snow.
- Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula, Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills, the Yukon Valley, and Lower Koyukuk Valley until noon tomorrow. 4 to 10 inches of snow.
- Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley until 3:00 P.M. tomorrow. 2 to 4 inches of snow.
- Chukchi Sea Coast and the Kobuk and Noatak Valleys until midnight tonight. 6 to 8 inches of snow.

A High Surf Advisory is in effect for St. Lawrence Island, the Bering Strait Coast and Eastern Norton sound until 3:00 P.M. tomorrow.

High Wind Warnings and Watches have been issued for the following areas:

- Denali along the Parks Highway near Healy through 3:00 PM Tuesday. 35 to 45 mph winds with gusts up to 75 mph.
- Eastern Alaska Range along the Richardson Highway North of Black Rapids and Deltana and Tanana Flats until 3:00 PM Tuesday. 35 to 45 mph winds with gusts up to 75 mph.
- Deltana and Tanana Flats, near Delta Junction until 3:00PM today. Southeast winds 20 to 30 mph with gusts up to 50 mph.

Coastal Flood Advisories have been issued for the following areas:

- Kuskokwim Delta until 4:00 P.M. today.
- Yukon Delta until 9:00 P.M. tomorrow.
- Southern Seward Peninsula Coast until 9:00 AM Wednesday.
- Chukchi Sea Coast until 3:00 PM Wednesday for minor coastal flooding.
