Significant Issues:

Unalaska Heavy Rainfall

Yesterday the SEOC held an interagency teleconference with the Qawalangin Tribe of Unalaska (QTU), FEMA, and others regarding their reported impacts from the recent mudslides and widespread flooding with in the City of Unalaska. Later in the afternoon, the SEOC received a signed local declaration from the Tribe. The SEOC will review this local declaration and continue to stay in contact with the community.

The SEOC also reached out to the City of Unalaska for an update. The City Department of Public Safety lowered their travel advisory from 2 to 1. The National Weather Service still has a flood warning in effect until 11:45 AM today. Ballyhoo & Captains Bay Roads are open but there are still potential safety concerns for these areas. Summer Bay Road and Overland Drive will remain closed for the foreseeable future. Wastewater system have improved but residents are still encouraged to conserve water. The SEOC will continue to support the City of Unalaska, and the Qawalangin Tribe of Unalaska during this event.

State of Alaska Department of Health (DOH)

The DOH is leading the State of Alaska COVID-19 Recovery, supported by the SEOC and other state departments as required.



Significant Weather:



Winter weather advisories are in effect for the following areas:

- City and Borough of Sitka until 9pm Friday for 3 to 6 inches of additional snow fall.
- Copper River Basin until 6pm Friday for wind chills as low as 55 degrees below zero.
- Central Interior, Kuskokwim Valley, across the Brooks Range, Koyukuk, Yukon Flats and Yukon Valleys until 6am Sunday for winds of 25mph with gusts up to 45mph.

Wind chill advisories and Blizzard warnings are in effect for Thompson Pass and Valdez until 8pm Friday. Winds gusting as high as 65mh will cause blizzard conditions and wind chills as low as 50 degrees below zero.

High wind warnings in effect across Lower Yukon Valley, Eastern Norton Sound, Southen Seward Peninsula Coast, St. Lawrence Island, and the Bering Strait Coast until 6pm Sunday for winds of 40 to 55mph with gusts up to 70mph.


Blizzard warning in effect for the Matanuska Valley until 8pm this evening, Winds of 35 to 55pmh with gusts up to 75mph are expected.

Winter storm warnings are in effect from Yakutat to Ketchikan through Saturday morning for heavy snow accumulation of 10 to 16 inches.

.Flood warning for the Eastern Aleutians in effect until 1145am Friday due to excessive rainfall causing flooding in small streams and low-lying areas.

Avalanche Forecast:



- Areas near Haines have a moderate advisory level above 1,500 ft.
- Areas near Cordova have a moderate advisory level above 2,000 ft.
- Areas near Valdez have a consiserable advisory level at all elevations.
- Turnagain Pass has moderate advisory conditions at this time.
