SEOC received a report from Tanana Chiefs Conference (TCC) of flooding in Allakaket with residents moving people and belongings to high ground. SEOC established positive communications with the community and TCC to gain situational awareness but there were no assistance requests at this time.

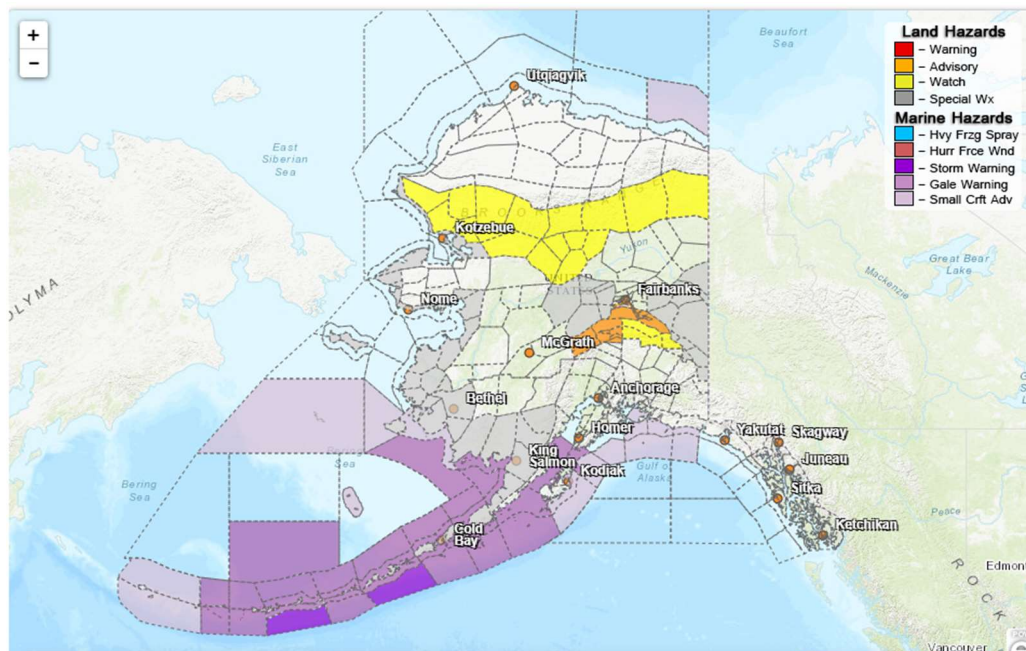

The following Warnings, Watches, and/or Advisories have been issued:

Flood Watch:

- Upper Kobuk and Noatak Valleys; Southeastern Brooks Range; Upper Koyukuk Valley – undefined.
- Coastal Prince William Sound – canceled.
- Lower Kobuk and Noatak Valleys – undefined.

Flood Advisory:

- Middle Tanana Valley; Deltana and Tanana Flats – in effect until noon AKDT Friday.

Wind Advisory:

- Denali – in effect from 10 AM AKDT Thursday to 4 AM AKDT Friday.
- Deltana and Tanana Flats – in effect from Noon Thursday to 10 AM AKDT Friday.

High Wind Watch:

- Eastern Alaska Range – in effect from Thursday afternoon through Friday morning.

Special Weather Statement:

- Eastern Alaska Range – High water on the Tanana River and Tributaries draining the Alaska Range.
- Kuskokwim Delta; Bristol Bay – Gusty winds and high waves expected Wednesday evening through Friday.
- Alaska Peninsula; Eastern Aleutians; Central Aleutians – Strong winds, high waves, and moderate to heavy rain expected Wednesday through Thursday.
- Chukchi Sea Coast; Baldwin Peninsula and Selawik Valley; Southern Seward Peninsula Coast; Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills; St Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast; Yukon Delta – Elevated surf Friday through Saturday.
