

# **Special Weather Statements:**

- Western Arctic Coast; Northwest Artic Coast; Noatak Valley; Kivalina and Red Dog Dock; Lower Kobuk Valley; Baldwin Peninsula; Northern Seward Peninsula; Shishmaref: Elevated Surf expected Wednesday night through Friday. Wind speeds up to 40 mph with the gusts up to 50 mph expected.
- Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast: Blowing snow this afternoon and tonight. Wind gusts up to 50 mph and visibility will be less than a mile at times this evening and tonight.
- Glacier Bay; Eastern Chichagof Island; Cape Fairwearther to Lisianski Strait; City and Borough of Stika; Admiralty Island; City and Borough of Juneau; Petersburg Borough; Western Kupreanof and Kuiu Island; City and Borough of Wrangell:

Ex Typhoon Bolaven will move into the Gulf of Alaska Tuesday morning, bringing widespread heavy rain with strong to high winds through Thursday. Saturated soils will also bring concerns for tree falls, mainly along riverbanks at this time. Rainfall amounts of 1 to 3 inches and strong gusts of 40 mph could be seen.

#### Watches:

• Prince of Wales Island; Ketchikan Gateway Borough; Annette Island: Flood watch remains in effect from late tonight through Thursday afternoon. Rainfall amounts of 3 to 5 inches. The highest likelihood of flooding will be for smaller/flashier streams and basins.

#### Warnings:

 Prince of Wales Island; Ketchikan Gateway Borough; Annette Island: High wind warning remains in effect from 10am this morning to 6pm Tuesday. Winds 25 to 35 mph with gusts up to 60 mph expected. Damaging winds will blow down trees and power lines. Widespread power outages are expected.
