Anderson Sewer System Issues

The City of Anderson and Village Safe Water continue to make progress thawing the main sewer lines and were able to restore the service line to one of the affected homes. The City of Nenana has offered their vacuum truck to assist with clearing the manholes. The SEOC will host a teleconference with stakeholders today to discuss the current status and progress, and to identify, coordinate and address short and long-term response issues and activity.

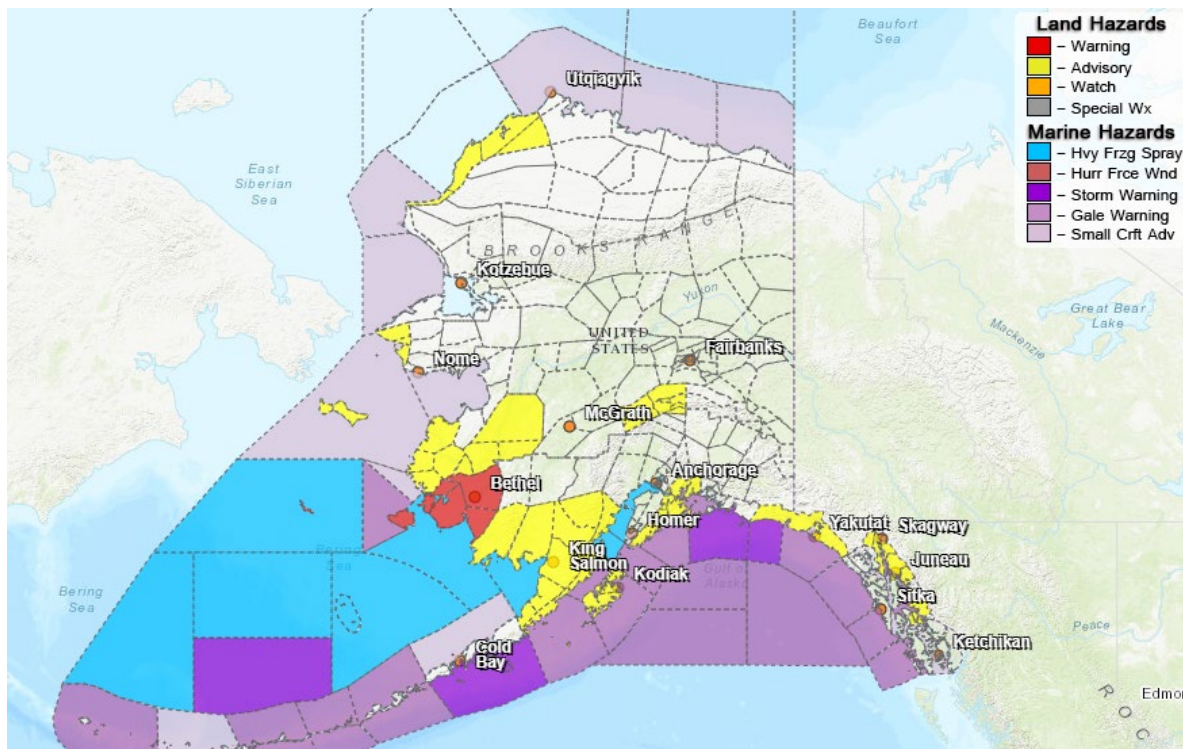

Winter Weather Advisories are in effect for Lower Yukon Valley; Yukon Delta; Petersburg Borough; City and Borough of Yakutat; City and Borough of Juneau; Haines Borough and Klukwan; City of Hyder; Western Prince William Sound; Kodiak Island; Bristol Bay; St. Lawrence Island and Bering Strait Coast through Saturday morning.

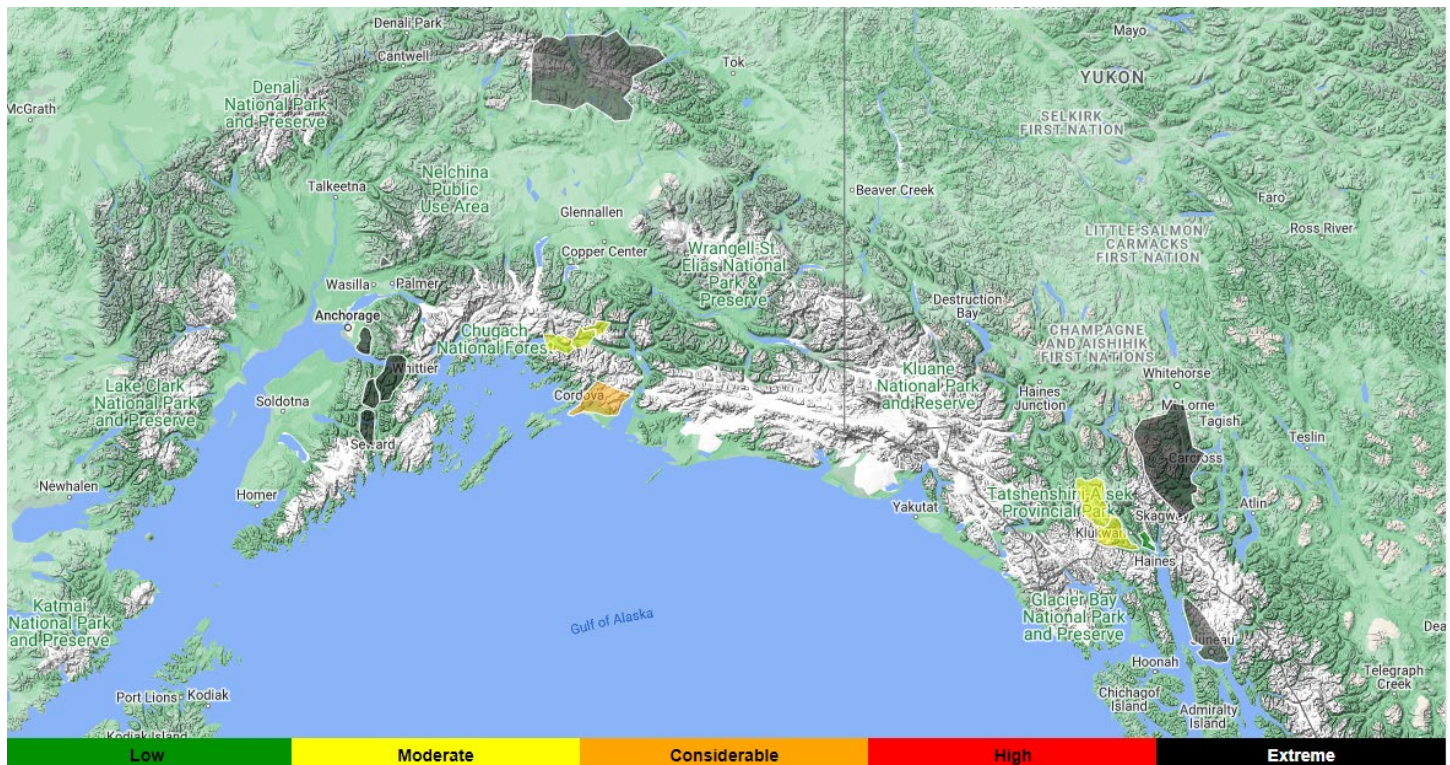
Blizzard Warning issued for the Pribilof Islands beginning this afternoon until 1:00 pm this afternoon for snow accumulation of 1 to 3 inches, winds gusting to 65 mph.

Blizzard Warning issued for Kuskokwim Delta until 7:00 pm today. With snow accumulations of up to one inch and wind gusts to 40 mph.

Wind Chill Advisories have been issued for Denali until 3:00 pm this afternoon; Yukon Delta; Lower Yukon Valley 9:00 am Saturday; Western Arctic Coast until midnight Saturday night.

Avalanche Forecast:



- Valdez area: Moderate advisory level at all elevations.
- Haines area: **Considerable Advisory level at 1,500 ft and above**; Low Advisory level below 1,500 ft.
- Cordova area: Considerable advisory level above 2,000 ft, moderate advisory level from 1,000 to 2,000ft and low advisory level below 1,000 ft near Cordova.
- **Turnagain Pass area: Considerable advisory below 2,500 ft; High Advisory above 2,500 ft.**
- Hatcher Pass area: Moderate advisory level at all elevations.
