

## Significant Weather:



Winter Storm Warning is in effect for the Municipality of Skagway, Haines, and Klukwan from 7am Wednesday until 10am Thursday for heavy snow accumulation of 7 to 14 inches and winds gusting to 35mph.

Winter Storm Watches are in effect for the following areas:

- City and Borough of Yakutat in effect Thursday evening through Friday night for 5 to 9 inches of snow and winds gusting to 40mph.
- Municipality of Skagway, Haines, and Kulkwan from Wednesday morning through Thursday morning for 8 to 16 inches of snow.

Winter Weather Advisories are in effect for the following areas:

- City and Borough of Juneau from 4am Wednesday until 6am Thursday for snow accumulation of 2 to 5 inches of rain followed by heavy rain.
- Eastern Aleutian Islands until 4am Thursday for snow accumulation of 2 to 5 inches and winds gusting to 55mph.
- Alaska Peninsula until 4pm today for 2 to 3 inches of snow and winds gusting to 50mph.
- Central Interior, Upper Koyukuk Valley, Yukon Flats until 6pm this evening for winds gusting to 40mph and wind chills of 45 below zero.


Wind Chill Advisories are in effect for the following areas:

 Northeastern Brooks Range, Southeastern Brooks Range, Central and Eastern Beaufort Sea Coast until noon today for wind chills as low as 55 below zero and winds gusting to 40mph.

Special weather statement has been issued for the Southern Seward Peninsula Coast, Eastern Norton Sound, and Nulato Hills. Winds of 15 to 25mph will causing blowing snow conditions through Wednesday.

#### <u>Avalanche Forecast:</u>



- Haines moderate avalanche conditions above 1,500ft and low below 1,500 ft.
- Valdez Low avalanche danger at all elevations.
- Cordova area: Considerable advisory level above1,000 ft and Moderate advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Turnagain Pass Low advisory level at all elevations.
- Hatcher Pass Moderate advisory level at all elevations and on slopes 35° and steeper.
