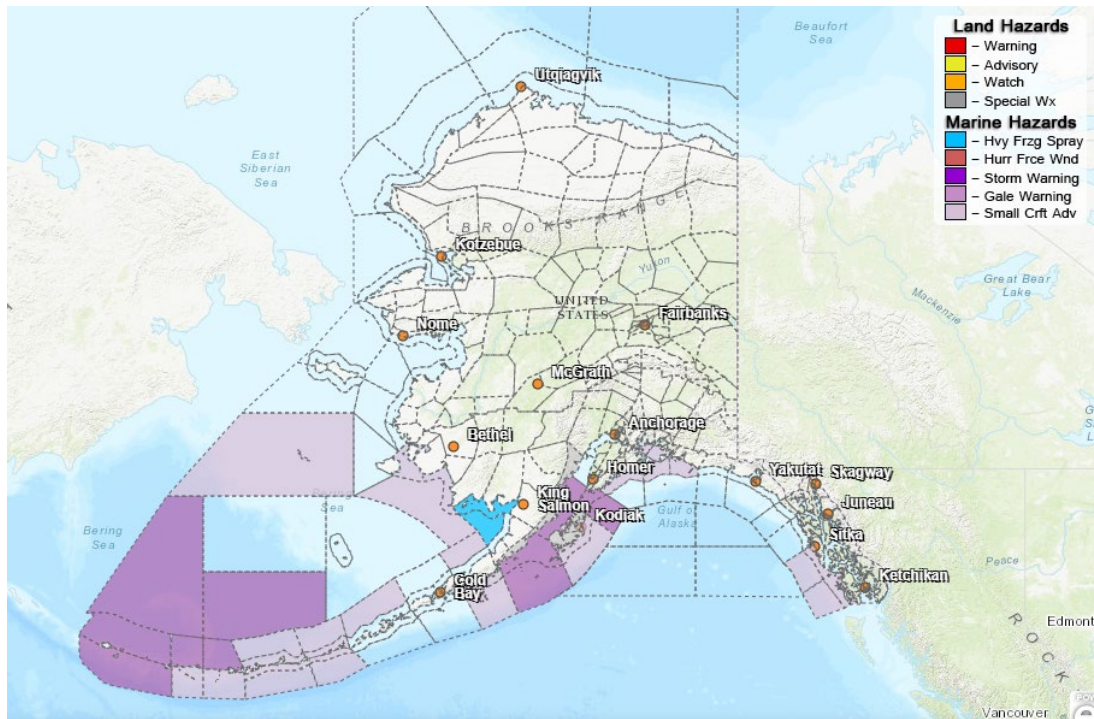

Significant Weather:



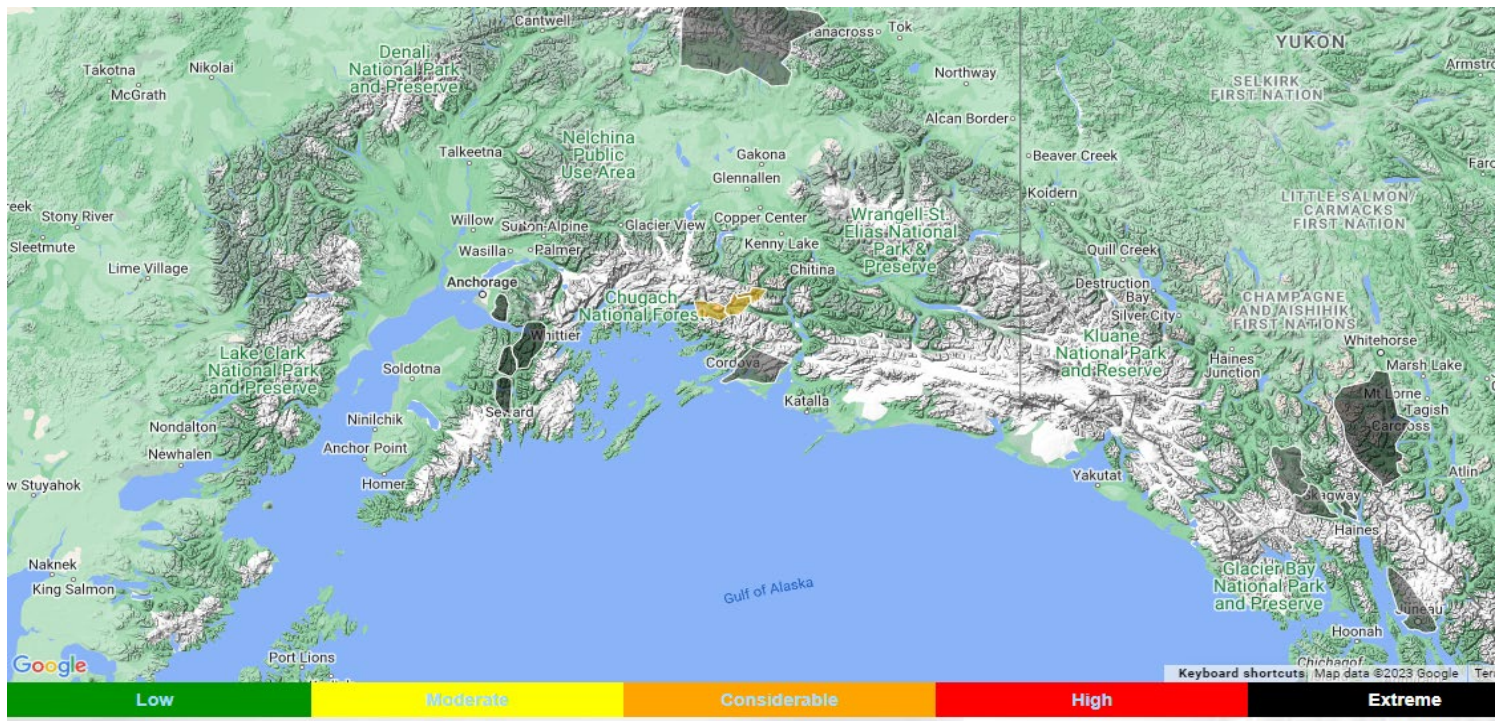
The following special weather statement has been issued:

Kodiak Island: RESUSPENDED ASH FROM KATMAI-NOVARUPTA EXPECTED OVER KODIAK ISLAND THROUGH MONDAY EVENING

Strong northwesterly winds will continue across Shelikof Strait and the waters around Kodiak Island through Monday evening. These winds are expected to continue resuspending ash from the 1912 Katmai-Novarupta eruption, potentially causing haze and trace amounts of ash accumulation. The villages of Karluk, Larsen Bay, and Akhiok are most likely to be impacted. Those with respiratory ailments in these areas are encouraged to avoid or reduce outdoor activity to avoid inhaling the ash. The winds will diminish by Monday evening through the overnight hours, bringing an end to the resuspension of ash.

Avalanche Forecast:



- **Valdez - Considerable avalanche advisory at all levels.**
- Haines - Considerable advisory level above 1,500ft and moderate advisory level below 1,500ft.
- Cordova area - Moderate advisory level above 2,000 ft, low advisory level below 1,000 ft.
- Turnagain Pass: Avalanche danger is considerable at all levels.
- Hatcher Pass – **Avalanche danger is moderate at all levels.**
