



River Watch 2023



River Watch Operations:

SEOC is activated to preparedness Level 2 for ongoing River Watch operations with two Divisions field deployed. SEOC has additional staff available for recall this weekend if required, and SEOC Operations staff and PIO are on weekend paid standby duty to offer support as needed.

The KUSKO Division: Yesterday, they assessed the Kuskokwim River from Bethel to Aniak, then returned to Bethel to participate in a radio call-in show with KYUK Radio where they answered questions on river conditions and flood preparedness. Today, the Division plans to fly the Kuskokwim to capture current conditions.

The Upper Yukon Division: Yesterday, the Division flew along the Yukon River and landed in Eagle and met with the Eagle Village Public Safety Officer. The community is well prepared for changing flood conditions. In addition, the Division also assessed ice and river conditions from Circle to Eagle and discovered that an ice jam in the area of Fortymile had flood waters out of the riverbanks and into the trees. In addition, they observed 10 cabins that were inundated to their rooflines. The Division notified Canadian authorities who later launched a SAR mission to rescue at least one cabin occupant. The Division has also received a report that water and ice is up to the guardrails on the Tylor Highway Bridge at Chicken. SEOC advised DOT/PF. A Flood Warning was issued but has since been brought back to a Flood Watch. The SEOC Division and locals will continue to update on conditions. Last night, Division members met with the area DOT liaison and Bridge Crew to coordinate updates, etc. Today, the Division plans to fly the region from Circle to Eagle again as the breakup front moves down the Yukon.

Napaskiak: SEOC received a local Declaration of Disaster Emergency for the community. Power has been restored, additional supplemental repairs on going on 2nd generator.

Central Interior, Flood Watch for ice jam in effect from Friday morning through Sunday morning.


Yukon Delta, High Wind Warning in effect from noon Saturday to 6am AKDT Sunday.
