Significant Issues:

The Alaska Wildland Fire Season is continuing to ramp up across the state, particularly in the Interior. Alaska Interagency Coordination Center elevated the preparedness level to PL3. Over 9,000 acres burned in the past 24 hours due to an additional 21 new fire starts.

The SEOC received and approved a resource request from State Forestry for a National Guard Blackhawk to aid in wildland fire suppression. The SEOC reached out to the Denali Borough and Red Cross of Alaska to discuss current fire activity and ensure open lines of communication. (See details in the fire report below)
