Significant Issues:

Kotzebue - Frozen Water Lines

SEOC continues to work with the City of Kotzebue, Maniilaq Association and the Northwest Arctic Borough regarding the frozen water lines and the emergency declaration submitted by the Borough. SEOC is reviewing the declaration and continues to support the local response and recovery operations through a multiagency partnership.

Koyukuk - Freeze Up

TCC RMW program sent a well pump and control box to Koyukuk last week. Two RMWs are expected to arrive in Koyukuk on Tuesday, February 13 and remain until Thursday to complete repairs. SEOC is continuing to monitor the situation.
