Significant Issues:

Taku River – Record High Water

On June 29, 2021 National Weather Service advised SEOC that the Taku River near Juneau was anticipated to experience record high water from glacial dam release of Lake Nolake and snowmelt runoff. Over the last two days, SEOC participated in multi-agency coordination calls with the US Coast Guard, Civil Air Patrol, Alaska State Troopers, Capital City Fire and Rescue, Alaska National Guard, and National Weather Service to confirm notification of residents along the river and contingency plan rescue operations.

The river crested yesterday approximately ½ foot over record flood stage and began receding. No rescues were required, and while some recreational property and residences experienced high water, there are currently no reports of substantial damage. The flood warning has been canceled.

Quinhagak Disaster Declaration - Riverbank Erosion

Yesterday, SEOC received the City of Qunhagak’s Resolution 21-02, Declaration of Disaster Emergency for river erosion along the Qanirtuuq [Kanektok] River. SEOC is working with the community and agency partners to research long-term erosion assistance options.

DHSS is now leading the State of Alaska COVID-19 Recovery through Department Operations, supported by SEOC and other state departments as required.

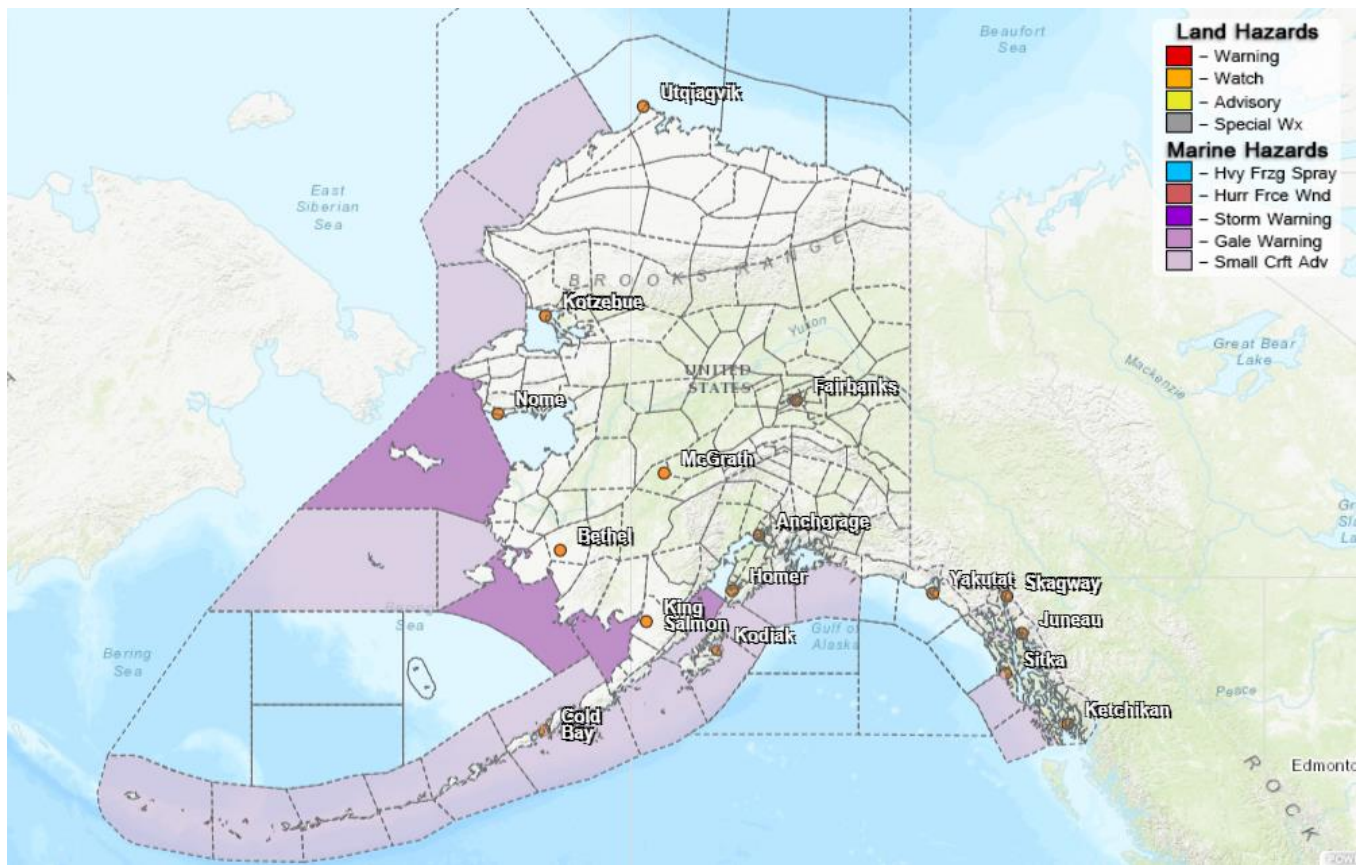
