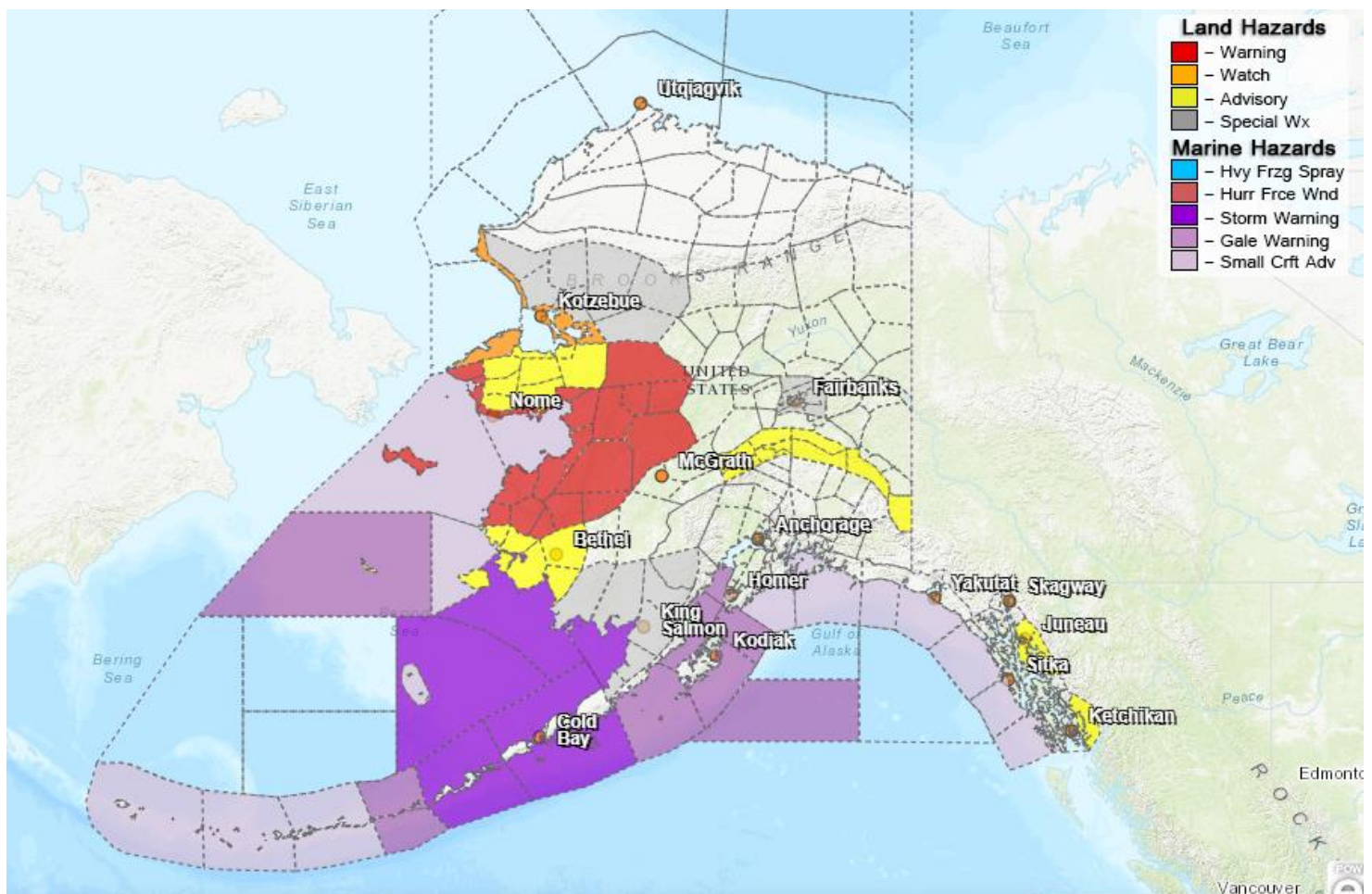

## Significant Weather:



Winter Storm Warnings have been issued for the following areas:

- Yukon Delta and the Lower Yukon Valley – 9:00 P.M. today through 9:00 P.M. Friday. 2 to 4 inches of snow and light ice accumulation.
- St. Lawrence Island, Bering Strait Coast, Lower Koyukuk and the Middle Yukon Valleys – 3:00 A.M. Friday through 3:00 A.M. Saturday. 2 to 4 inches of snow with localized amounts of up to 8 inches.
- Eastern Norton Sound, Nulato Hills and the Southern Seward Peninsula Coast – 3:00 A.M. Friday to 6:00 A.M. Friday. 3 to 5 inches of snow with localized amounts of up to 7 inches.

A Winter Storm Watch has been issued for the Baldwin Peninsula, Selawik Valley and Chukchi Sea Coast for Friday afternoon and night. Heavy blowing snow with accumulations of up to 3 inches is possible.

Dense Fog Advisories remain in effect for Hyder and Juneau until 10:00 A.M. today.

High Wind Advisories have been issued for Denali and the Eastern Alaska Range for tonight through Friday night. Winds gusting up to 60 mph are possible.

Winter Weather Advisories have been issued for the following areas:

- Pribilof Islands – 2:00 P.M. today through midnight tonight. 1 inch of snow and winds gusting to 40mph.
- Kuskokwim Delta – 9:00 P.M. today through 6:00 P.M. Friday. 1 to 3 inches of snow and winds gusting to 50mph.
- Northern and Interior Seward Peninsula – Friday afternoon through Saturday afternoon. 2 to 4 inches of snow with localized amounts of up to 7 inches.

A Special Weather Statement has been issued for the Bristol Bay area. Strong southeasterly winds and blowing snow are possible beginning this evening through tomorrow morning.
