Significant Issues:

The SEOC deployed one SEOC Public Information Officer to Florida on Friday to assist the state with recovery from Hurricane Ian through the interstate mutual aid Emergency Management Assistance Compact.

Major Coastal Sea Storms

Overall incident operations for the 2022 September West Coast Storm (DR-4672) disaster have transitioned from response in the SEOC to recovery coordinated through the State/FEMA Joint Field Office (JFO). Mass care operations will continue to be coordinated through the SEOC through November 11th and then transition to the JFO for long-term and occasional Mass Care support for feeding and interim housing identification.

State of Alaska Department of Health (DOH)

The DOH is leading the State of Alaska COVID-19 Recovery, supported by the SEOC and other state departments as required.

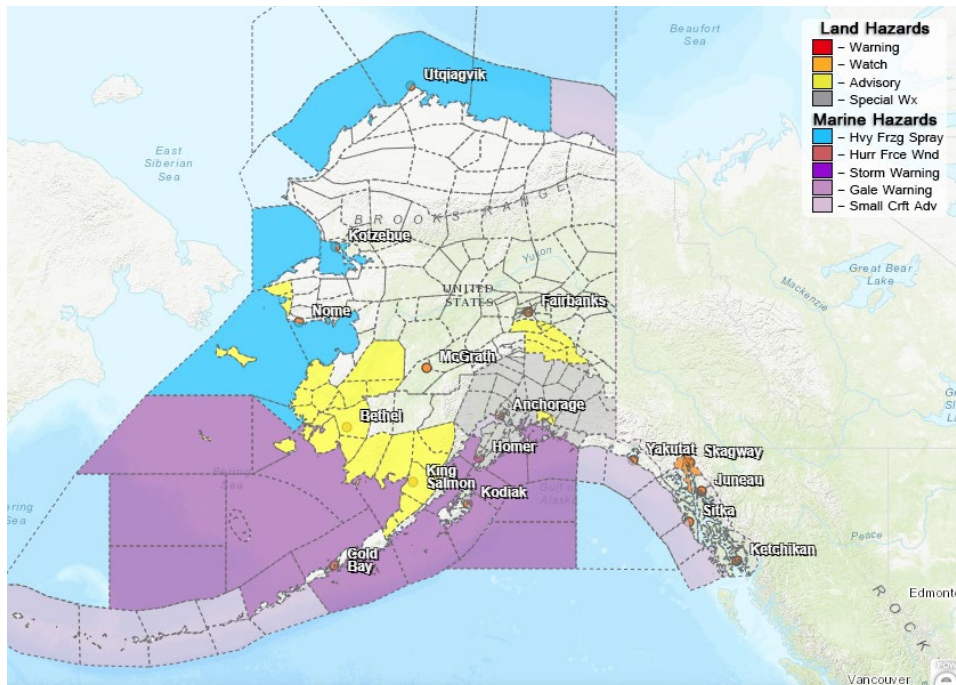

Significant Weather:



A Winter Storm Watch remains in effect from Wednesday Morning through Thursday Morning for the Klondike Highway north of 4 Mile and the Haines Highway, mainly NW of 20 Mile. Heavy snow possible with total accumulations of 47 to 8 inches.

Wind advisory in effect from Midnight tonight to 4:00pm Wednesday for Deltana and Tanana Flats. East winds 20 to 30 mph gusts around 50 mph expected.

Wind advisory in effect from Midnight tonight to 4:00pm Wednesday for the Eastern Alaska Ranger near passes. Southeast winds 25 to 35 mph with gusts up to 60 mph expected.

Winter Weather Advisory in effect from 7:00PM this evening to 4:00PM Wednesday for the Yukon Delta South of St. Mary's and the Lower Yukon Valley South of Anvik. Snow is expected with total accumulations of up to two inches and winds gusting up to 50 mph.

A Winter Storm Warning is in effect until 1:00 P.M. today for the Upper Tanana Valley and Fortymile Country. An additional 2 inches of heavy snowfall is expected across the area along the Alaska Highway from Dot Lake to the east.

Special Weather statement issued for a Snow Event throughout Southcentral into Wednesday. 1 to 6 inches+ expected depending on location.

Winter Weather Advisory in effect from 1:00am to 4:00pm Wednesday for Thompson Pass. Blowing snow with total accumulations of 6 to 9 inches with winds gusting as high as 45 mph with reduced visibility down to ½ mile.

Coastal Flood Advisory in effect from 8:00pm Tuesday to 10:00am Wednesday for the Bristol Bay Coast from Jacksmith Bay to Togiak. Water levels are expected to rise 3 to 6 feet above normal high tides.

Winter Weather Advisory in effect from 1:00pm Tuesday to 7:00am Wednesday for the Kuskokwim Delta. Blowing snow and reduced visibility expected, along with Northeasterly winds gusting as high as 35 mph.

A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect from 6:00 P.M. today until 4:00 P.M. tomorrow for St. Lawrence Island and the Bering Strait Coast. 4 inches of snowfall with high winds and near blizzard conditions are possible.
