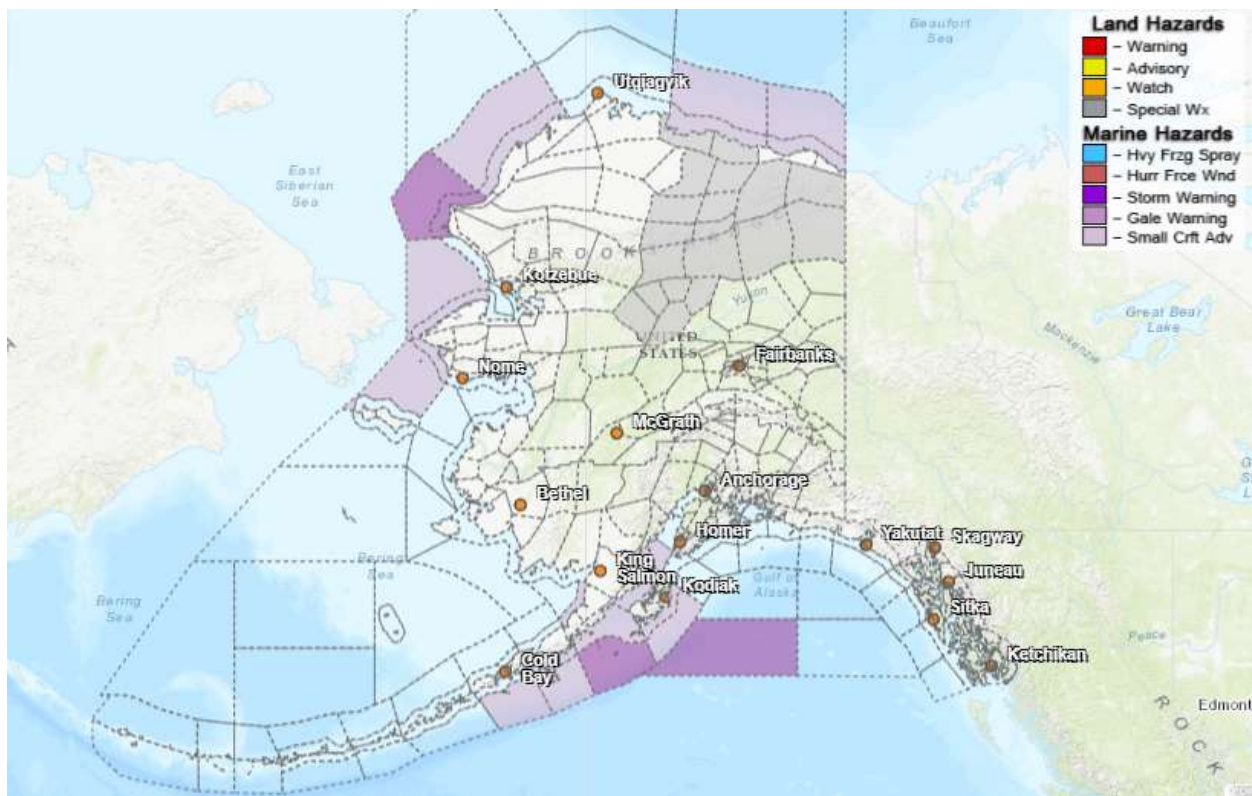

Significant Weather:



- Special weather statement in effect for the Southeastern Brooks Range, and Upper Koyukuk Valley for moderate to heavy rain showers through Saturday morning. Periods of rain will result in an area of 0.5 to 1.00 inches of additional accumulations in the Eastern Brooks Range and Upper Koyukuk Valley. This rain may cause minor rises in rivers and streams draining the Brooks Range. At this point, significant impacts are not expected.
- Special weather statement in effect for the Northeastern Brooks Range for moderate to heavy rain showers through Saturday morning. Periods of rain will result in an area of 0.5 to 1.00 inches of additional accumulations in the Eastern Brooks Range and Upper Koyukuk Valley. This rain may cause minor rises in rivers and streams draining the Brooks Range. At this point, significant impacts are not expected.
- Special Weather Statement in effect for Central Beaufort Sea Coast for Sag River Causing Erosion Along the Dalton Highway - The Sagavanirktok River is currently flowing out of its bank due to remnant ice in the main channel. This is forcing the water over its bank to the west and causing erosion along the Dalton Highway near milepost 403. These conditions are expected to persist until ice in the main channel clears. Elevated flows are expected to continue, especially with rainfall expected late this week. Travelers are urged to call 511 or visit 511.alaska.gov for the latest on road conditions in the area.
