Incident Overview

State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) Activated to Level 2

Riverwatch 2018 began on 4/30/2018 with the SEOC standing up to a Level 2 Preparedness Level.

Upper Yukon Division:

Daily flights monitoring river ice status between Circle and Fort Yukon. Ice run is estimated at 50 miles long and expected to move through Circle this evening.

Fairbanks Division:

A Fairbanks Division opened today to monitor the status of the Chena Flood Control Project for the next few days. This Division is staffed in the SEOC.


