

The State Emergency Operations Center will conduct the required monthly test, (RMT) of the Emergency Alert and Amber Alert System today at 1020, Alaska time. There will be no Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) activation with today's test. The National Periodic Test, that was also scheduled for today has been postponed and rescheduled for Wednesday, October 3rd.

Significant Weather



The frost advisory for the cities of Yakutat, Petersburg, and Kake expires at 9 am today. There is also a special weather statement for the western Kenai Peninsula because Skilak Glacier-Dammed Lake is releasing. NWS advises residents along the Kenai River downstream of Skilak Lake should be aware of rising water through Saturday.

Water levels on the Kenai River downstream of Skilak Lake are expected to rise an additional 1 to 2 feet from current levels, then fall on Sunday after the release is completed.
