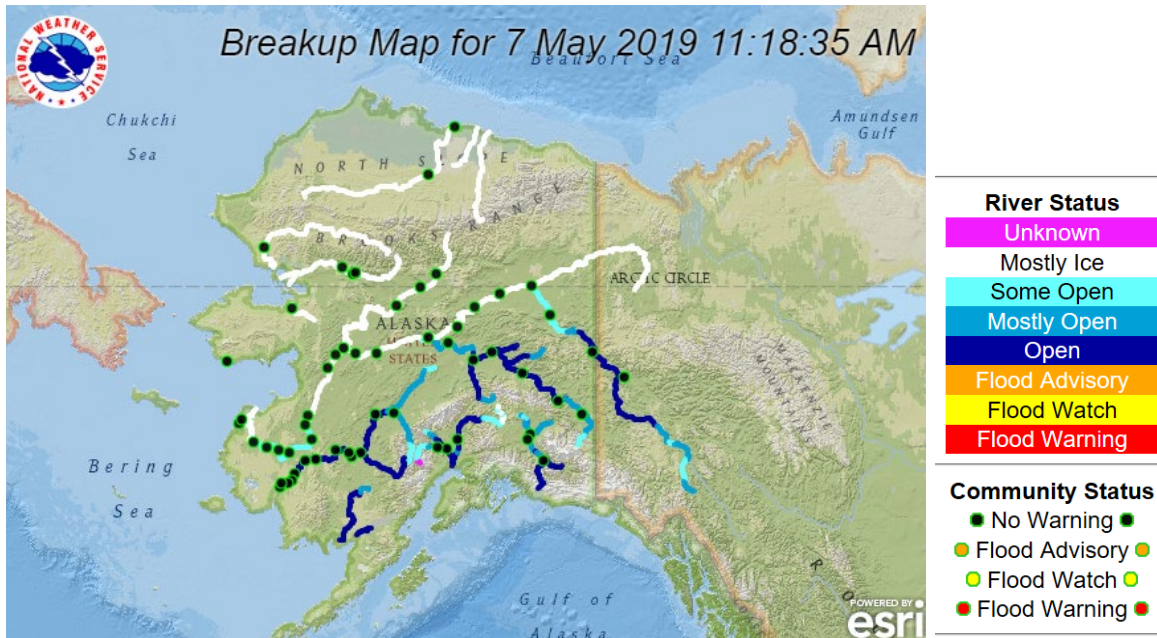
Cook Inlet M7.1 Earthquake (FEMA Declaration 4413-DR)

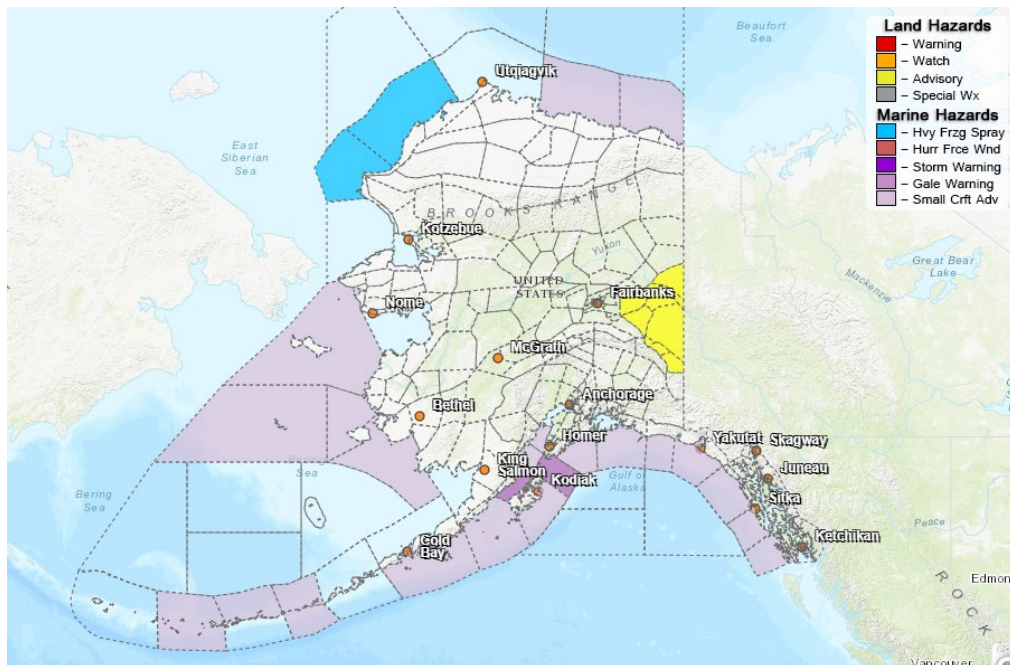
Riverwatch 2019: The Middle Yukon team will deploy this week. No breakup issues have been reported so far.
