THREAT LEVEL CHANGES: SEOC LEVEL 1 – ROUTINE OPERATIONS

Significant Issues:

Interior Heavy Rainfall Forecast – Atmospheric River

The National Weather Service advised SEOC yesterday that heavy rains will be coming to Interior Alaska this week. This atmospheric river follows one that brought heavy rainfall this past weekend. As a result, rivers and streams are already full and soils are saturated. The Weather Service anticipates high water or flooding in the Tanana Basin drainages including the Kuskokwim and on the Chena River Basin primarily near the Moose Creek Dam. SEOC contacted the Denali Borough and Fairbanks North Star Borough Emergency Managers with this information yesterday and will carefully monitor this weather system this week.

Napakiak Tank Farm

The US Coast Guard advised the SEOC yesterday afternoon about bank erosion threatening the tank farm in Napakiak. The Coast Guard intends to deploy a team today to pursue off loading fuel from the tank farm to prevent a spill. SEOC will follow up on this today.

2019 Fire Season


The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center, (AICC) is at Preparedness Level 2.

Significant Weather:



Special weather statements for heavy rain expected through tonight in the central interior including Denali, Middle Tanana Valley, Southeastern Brooks Range and the Upper Koyukuk Valley.

Flood Watch remains in effect from Tuesday morning through Wednesday night for Denali including Healy, Denali National Park, Carlo Creek, Middle Tanana Valley and Kantishna.

Many portions of the west coast and western interior have a special weather statement issued for rising river levels due to heavy rain through Tuesday.

Wind advisory in effect from midnight tonight to 6 am akdt Wednesday for the Yukon Flats and Surrounding Uplands. Special weather statement for breezy conditions also expected in the Haines Borough, Lynn Canal, Juneau Borough and northern panhandle.
