2019 Fire Season

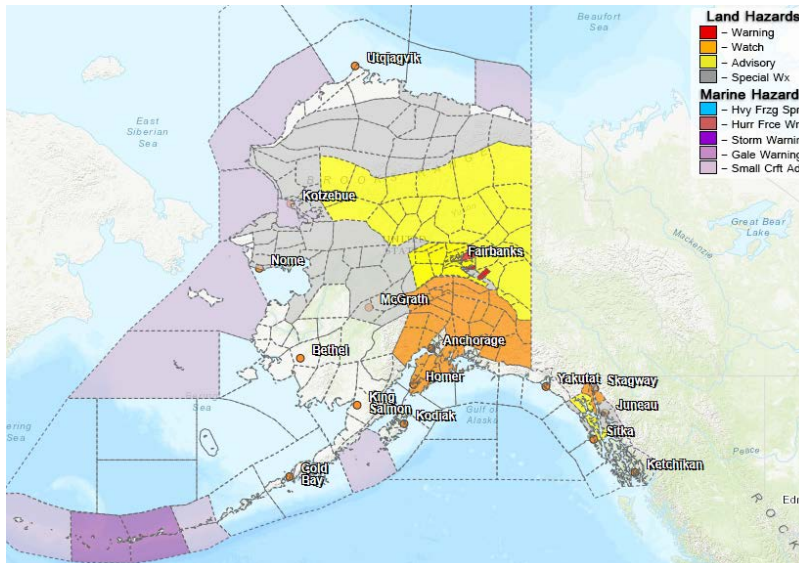
The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center, (AICC) is at Preparedness Level 2.

Significant Weather:



A Fire Weather Watch and High Wind Watch is in effect from Saturday afternoon through the evening for the Interior Kenai Peninsula, Eastern Kenai Peninsula, Susitna Valley and the Copper River Basin due to hot, dry and windy conditions.

A High Wind Watch is in effect from Saturday afternoon through the evening for the Interior Kenai Peninsula, Eastern Kenai Peninsula, Susitna Valley and the Copper River.

Special Weather Statements for much of the interior of Alaska have been issued through the weekend due to heavy rain, high water conditions, and possible rock and mud slides.

Special Weather Statements have been issued for Northern Alaska the West Coast and Western Interior due to heavy rain and rising rivers river conditions.

Due to heavy rains a Flood Warning has been issued through Saturday morning for Middle Tanana Valley, Tanana Flats, Deltana, Upper Tanana Valley and Fortymile Country, with Flood Advisories and Watches for the Central Interior, Eastern Alaska Range and Denali.
