Significant Issues:

Wildland Fires

This incident has transitioned to the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management’s Disaster Assistance section for implementation of the Individual Assistance, Temporary Housing, and Public Assistance programs under the Governor’s declaration of disaster.

Application for State Disaster Individual Assistance remains available online through October 22, 2019.

Water Shortages

The SEOC continues to assist communities within the Lake and Peninsula and Kenai Peninsula Boroughs, to recover from their shortage of fresh water. The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation has been working with the communities to provide technical assistance. Regional tribal health organizations, and volunteer and faith-based organizations have been furnishing the following communities with a temporary water supply:

- Chignik Lagoon
- Seldovia
- Nanwalek

2019 Fire Season

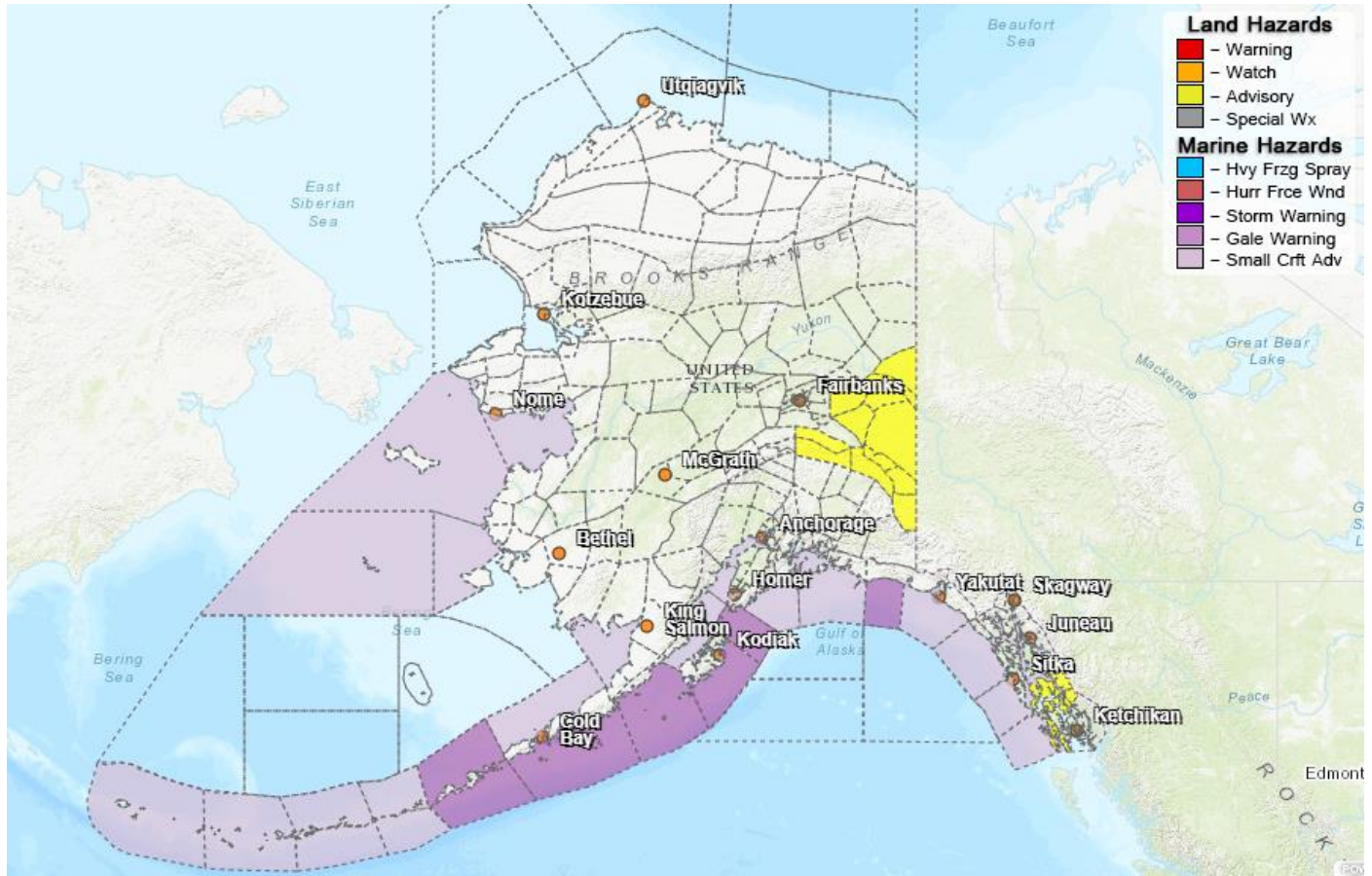
The Alaska Interagency Coordination Center is at Preparedness Level 2.

- Total Fires = **719**
- Total Acres = **2,585,611.1** There are currently **178** active fires with 4 fires currently staffed.
