- 3/11 Governor Dunleavy declares a Public Health Disaster Emergency.
- 3/14 Governor Dunleavy announces the first confirmed case of COVID-19 in Alaska.
- 3/20 Governor Dunleavy announces Alaska COVID-19 Economic Stabilization Plan
- 3/25 First out-of-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Washington.
- 3/27 First in-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Anchorage.
- 3/28 Case count in the state exceeds 100.
- 4/3 Case count in the state exceeds 150.
- 4/7 Case count in the state exceeds 200.
- 4/9 President Trump approves a major disaster declaration for Alaska.
- 4/11 Case count in the state exceeds 250.
- 4/16 Case count in the state exceeds 300.
- 4/28 Case count in the state exceeds 350.

Reopen Alaska Responsibly Plan:

<u>Health Mandate 016</u> includes updates to multiple existing mandates as part of a phased reopening of the state economy.

*Mandate 16 has undergone several revisions expanding reopening efforts. Please see its addendums for additional information.

<u>Health Mandate 017</u> established protective measures for defined independent commercial fishing vessels.

Intrastate Travel:

<u>Health Mandate 018</u> permits intrastate travel between communities located on the road system, and/or the Marine Highway system, for all purposes. Recommended precautions are included in the mandate.

Intrastate travel by other means remains restricted.

*Health Mandate 18 supersedes Mandate 012, and Mandate 016-Attachment M.

<u>Health Mandate 014</u> implements a temporary quarantine and isolation program utilizing non-congregate shelter solutions.

<u>Health Mandate 015,</u> Services by Health Care Providers, went into effect in phases.


