- 11 MAR 20 – Gov Dunleavy declares a Public Health Disaster Emergency.
- 14 MAR 20 – Gov Dunleavy Announces first confirmed case in Alaska.
- 20 MAR 20 – Gov Dunleavy Announces Alaska COVID-19 Economic Stabilization Plan. DHSS announces 12th confirmed case in state.
- 25 MAR 20 – First out-of-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Washington.
- 27 MAR 20 – First in-state death of an Alaska resident reported in Anchorage.
- 28 MAR 20 – Case count in the state exceeds 100.
- 03 APR 20 – Case count in the state exceeds 150.

Government Services

Schools:

The State of Alaska (SOA) Health Mandate 008 (3/20) dictates that all scheduled public-school days through May 1, 2020 will be non-student contact days in which students will not be attending school. Schools have begun deployment of distance learning.

Child Care:

DHSS is fielding questions from licensed providers. Guidance was published in the SOA Health Alert 008 (3/17). Additional guidance will be provided as necessary.



Community Safety

Social Distancing and Enforced Closure of Public Spaces:

SOA Health Mandate 011 (3/28) mandates all individuals cease gatherings with non-family members regardless of number of people present. This includes weddings, church or other faith-based gatherings, and graduations.

Further the order mandates those that are ill or displaying symptoms of illness must remain home except to seek medical care as required.

The order additionally required all non-governmental and non-critical infrastructure businesses to close, effective 5:00 p.m. on March 28 until further notice. Permissible activities for businesses during the closure are limited to defined minimum basic operations. The mandate will be reevaluated on April 11.

International & Interstate Travel:

SOA Health Mandate 010 (3/23) orders a mandatory 14-day self-quarantine for both international & interstate travelers (resident or non-resident) traveling to Alaska; failure to follow this order is punishable by the law.

		<p>United States and Canada are temporarily restricting all non-essential travel across the ALCAN border. “Non-essential” travel includes travel that is considered tourism or recreational in nature.</p> <p>Intrastate Travel: <u>SOA Health Mandate 012 (3/28)</u> suspends all in-state travel unless necessary to support identified critical infrastructure or for identified critical personal needs. A number of communities have enacted additional screening requirements in addition to those outlined in the Governor’s Health Mandates.</p>

Food Distribution Programs:

Due to school closures, school lunch programs transitioned to alternative delivery. The SEOC is unaware of any current unmet needs.

There are no disruptions to the commercial food supply chain at this time.

Laboratory:

Statewide Case Count totals: 191 positive/23 hospitalized/24 recovered/6 deaths*

A total of 6,883 tests have been conducted within the state.

Patient Movement

Emergency Medical Flight Services:

Air Operations Branch is developing agreements for temporary helicopter pad use at alternate care sites to facilitate the transport of COVID-19 patients.

Local health providers are experiencing disruptions to routine patient movement as a result of air carrier instability

	 <p>Medical Supply Chain</p>	<p>Blood Bank: Blood Bank of Alaska has reported blood shortages due to the coronavirus outbreak. They are continuing to solicit for healthy donors.</p> <p>Distribution: Efforts continue to source sufficient personal protective equipment and materials such as ventilators for hospitals statewide. Alaska has received 2 shipments from the DHHS Strategic National Stockpile to date.</p>
	 <p>Medical Care</p>	<p>Hospitals: <u>Health Mandate 005</u> (3/19) suspended all non-urgent and elective procedures for 3 months to assist with conservation of medical supplies.</p>

Snow through Tuesday. Poor Hwy conditions. Snow removal N Parks Hwy. IFR this afternoon and evening.

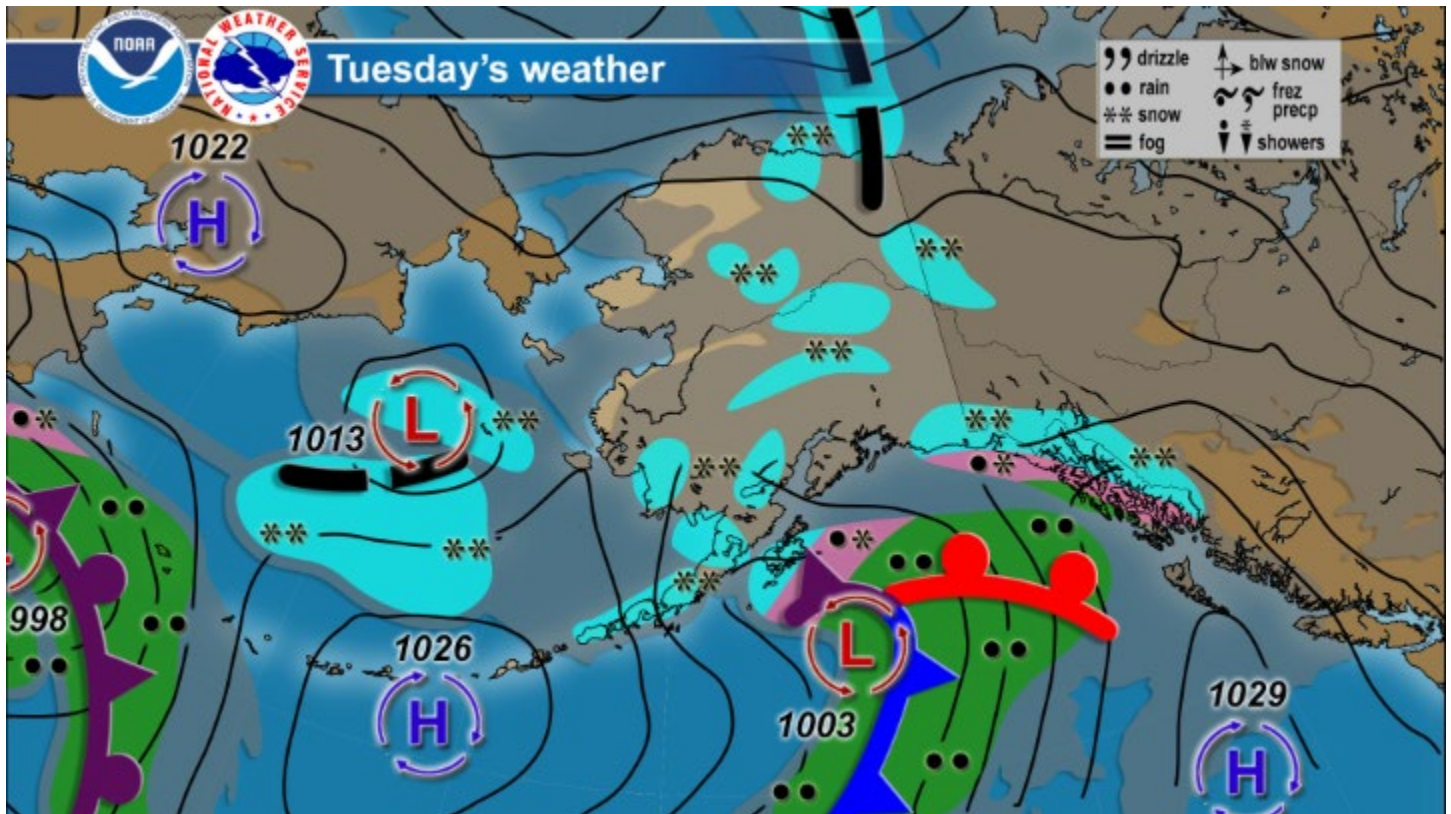
Mat-Su
