

## Significant Weather:



A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect for the Anchorage area until 1:00 P.M. today. 6 to 12 inches of snow is possible in the Anchorage and Eagle River Hillside areas with lesser amounts expected in East Anchorage and areas with lower elevations.

A Special Weather Statement has been issued for Kodiak Island. Strong winds above 50mph have resuspended ash from the 1912 Novarupta eruption reducing visibility and air quality in the area. The winds are expected to subside late today.

A Special Weather Statement has been issued for the southern Panhandle. Heavy rainfall over the past 24 hours has caused sharp rises in rivers and streams. No flooding is expected, but there is a risk of mudslides in the area.

A Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect for Deltana and Tanana Flats, the Eastern Alaska Range, and Denali until 6:00 A.M. Saturday. Winds gusting to 30mph and up to 8 inches of snowfall is possible across the region.

A Special Weather Statement remains in effect for the Central Interior, Yukon Flats, and the Tanana Valley until 5:00 P.M. today. 2 to 4 inches of snowfall is expected across the region.
