

## Significant Weather:



Winter Weather Advisories are in effect for the following areas:

- Yakutata until noon today. 3 to 6 inches of snow.
- Yukon Delta and the lower Yukon Valley until 3:00 P.M. today. 2 to 4 inches of snow.
- Southern Baranof Island and Port Alexander until 6:00 P.M. today. 3 to 6 inches of snow.
- Eastern Norton Sound and Nulato Hills until 9:00 P.M. today. 1 to 4 inches of snow.
- Craig, Hollis, Hydaburg, Ketchikan and Klawock until midnight tonight. 2 to 4 inches of snow and 35mph winds.
- Lower Koyukuk and the middle Yukon Valleys until noon tomorrow. 3 to 7 inches of snow.
- Central Interior north of Minto from 3:00 P.M. today until 3:00 P.M. tomorrow. 4 to 6 inches of snow.

Special Weather Statements have been issued for the following areas:

- Anchorage and the Mat-Su Valley. Freezing perciptation is likely across the region this morning until 11:00 A.M.
- The central and eastern Interior. Significant snowfall along with high winds and freezing rain is possible next week from Sunday night into Tuesday. Up to 6 to 12 inches of snow accumulation is possible.
- Multiple weather systems are expected to impact the Yukon Delta beginning today and continuing through the weekend. These storms are likely to bring widespread blizzard conditions, heavy snow, the chance for mixed precipitation, high winds and the possibility of storm surge flooding.
