

Significant Issues:

Lowell Point Landslide

Lowell Point Road is expected to reopen to traffic on Friday, May 27th at noon. This will be followed by intermittent closures to continue debris clearing and repairs.

River Watch 2022

The SEOC deployed a team to the communities of Glennallen, Gulkana, and Copperville Tuesday to meet with community leaders and survey the areas impacted by flooding. They were able to provide technical guidance and advice to the community as they move from response to recovery.

The 2022 Spring Floods, the 2022 Lowell Point Landslide in the City of Seward, and the Galena Fire Hall roof collapse will now be eligible for State of Alaska disaster recovery programs. Individuals and families can now apply for state disaster grants. See https://ready.alaska.gov/ for details.

The Riverwatch teams have been demobilized, and have transitioned to flood response and recovery. Continuing to monitor for potential snowmelt flooding concerns.

Flood Advisories remain in effect for the following areas:

- Copper River Basin Snowmelt flooding continues along the Gulkana River and Lake Louise Road. The advisory expires at 10:00 A.M. today 5/26.
- Shageluk Minor flooding on the Innoko River is expected until 10:00 A.M. today.

Fire Weather:

- Fire weather watch for Southcentral from Friday morning though Saturday evening for hot, dry and windy conditions for Anchorage, Mat-Su and Kink River vallies, and Kenai Peninsula.
- Fire weather watch in effect from Friday morning through Saturday evening for hot, dry, and windy conditions for Northern Bristol Bay inland areas.

Burn permits have been suspended for most of south central and the southern interior due to high fire risk conditions. In effect for Fairbanks, Railbelt, and Salcha-Burning is Suspended May 24th though May 27
